

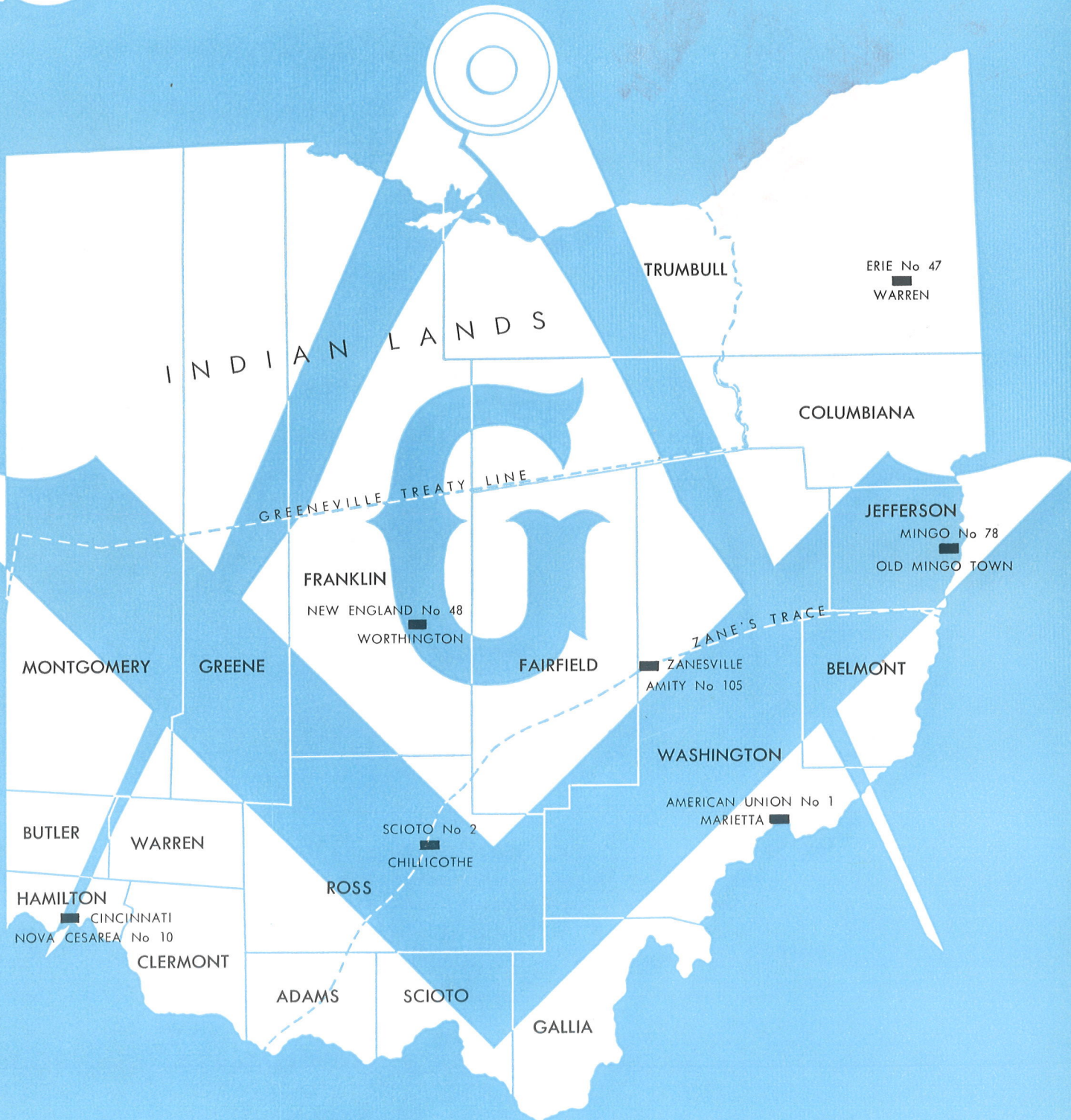

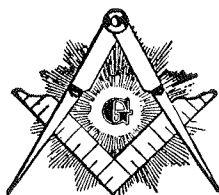

FOREWORD

In preparing the following History of Scioto Lodge No. 6 it was originally intended to no more than briefly amend and bring up to date the History of Scioto Lodge No. 6 as prepared by Brothers Hamill, Evans and Scholl in 1936. After considerable preliminary work it was decided that a major revision was required. The following material was therefore assembled from various sources and written by Brother R. C. Bradbury. Following the original writing it was reviewed and amended by the committee consisting of R. C. Bradbury, Howard W. Laymon, and Cecil S. Blair.

The following sources of information were consulted and copied directly or rewritten as seemed most convenient:

The minutes of Scioto Lodge from 1805 to 1955 inclusive.

"History of Scioto Lodge No. 6" by William E. Evans, published in the Scioto Gazette in 1912.

"History of Scioto Lodge No. 6" by Allen W. Hamill, Albert Scholl, and Lyle S. Evans in 1936.

"History of Freemasonry in Ohio" in three volumes by W. M. Cunningham and published by the Grand Secretary in 1909.

Proceedings of the Grand Lodge of Ohio, 1808 to 1953 inclusive.

"Chillicothe, 1811" by William R. Southward, originally published in the Scioto Gazette in 1866 and republished in pamphlet form by David K. Webb in 1950.

"Chillicothe, Ohio's First Capital," a pamphlet published by the Chillicothe Civic Association in 1941.

"Chillicothe and Ross County," a booklet sponsored by the Ross County Northwest Territory Committee in 1938.

Photo-Static copies of Volume 4, pages 403-404 and Volume 2, page 94 of the Ross County Ohio, Deed Records showing the location of certain property owned by Thomas Needham. These records were discovered as the result of a personal search by Brother Cecil S. Blair.

It is hoped that this history will not only bring to light the more important events in the history of Scioto Lodge, but also the personal records of some of our distinguished members, the historical background or related events in the fraternity, and some trivial details which have been at least entertaining.

It is hoped that nothing written will be found in bad taste or reflect unfavorably upon the lodge or any person. It is hoped that all will recognize that the errors of omission and commission arise from human frailties rather than intent.

Sesquicentennial History of Scioto Lodge No. 6, F.&A.M.

Chillicothe, Ohio

On March 1, 1786 General Rufus Putnam and his associates, nearly all of whom were Freemasons, met at "The Bunch of Grapes Tavern", in the City of Boston, Massachusetts for the purpose of forming a company to buy land in what is now Ohio. Thus was formed the Ohio Company. On July 23, 1787 Congress empowered the Board of the Treasury to contract for the sale of a tract of land North of the Ohio River and East of the Scioto River.

As the result of these events, the City of Marietta was settled in 1787-1788 and a short time thereafter, June 28, 1790, American Union Lodge No. 1 was established in that city.

The tract of land between the Scioto River and the Little Miami River was reserved in its deed to the United States Government for the purpose of establishing the Virginia Military District. The purpose of this district was to reward citizens of Virginia, who had fought in the Revolutionary War, with grants of land. The grants were made in accord with the rank of the person serving and the length of such service.

In order to handle the details involved in these land transactions the State of Virginia established a land office at Chillicothe. Settlers came up the Scioto River to establish homes in the new country. Chillicothe was platted and became a city in 1796. Among its first citizens could be found Freemasons from Virginia and in even larger numbers from the New England States.

In 1803 Ohio became a state and the legislature met in Chillicothe which was selected as the capital of the new state. A number of the delegates to the legislature were members of the Masonic Order, and they and others felt that a lodge should be located at Chillicothe. These members subsequently petitioned the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts for a charter. The minutes of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts for September 10, 1805 read as follows:—

"A petition was presented, through the R. W. and Rev'd Thad's M. Harris, from Thomas Gibson and others, praying for a charter to hold a lodge in the town of Chillicothe, State of Ohio, by the name of Scioto Lodge, which was granted unanimously."

The original minute book of Scioto Lodge contains the record of the first meeting held on the 22nd day of November, 1805.

The following were elected officers of the lodge;—
Thomas Gibson, Worshipful Master
Jervis Cutler, Senior Warden
Nathaniel Willis, Junior Warden
Joseph Dix, Secretary Pro Tem

Another meeting was held on the 4th day of December of the same year, and the lodge was opened in the First Degree. At that time the names of the additional officers appear as follows;—

Francis McHenry, Senior Deacon
Seth Thompson, Junior Deacon
James Davenport, Secretary
Oliver Strong, Tyler

Members present were; — Peter Marks, Joseph Dix, M. Mason, William Wilson and Visiting Brothers General Joseph Bewell, Elijah Heath and John McDonald.

At this meeting the by-laws of the lodge were adopted. These are worth reading because of their quaint language and the peculiar phrasing used. We will not attempt to quote all of them, but will call certain interesting points to your attention.

In the second section of the by-laws, it is provided that, "the Lodge comes to order in half an hour after the time ordered for the meeting—to wit, from March 25th to the 25th of September between the hours of four and ten in the evening, and from September 25th to the 25th of March, between the hours of five and nine." On reading the minutes of the lodge it is found that special meetings were sometimes called "at early candle-light."

In the third section it is provided that, "when the Master or Deputy takes the chair and calls to order, the brethren take their seats, and on the third stroke of the Master's gavel there shall be a **profound** silence."

Among the duties of the Secretary, it is provided that, "he shall keep a registry of all transactions and proceedings that are **fit to be committed to writing.**"

The fifth section provides that each member be subject to pay a fine of thirty cents for neglect of his attendance on regular nights, unless the majority shall think his excuse sufficient, and shall receive it as such, besides the sum of two shillings and six pence to be considered as the common monthly expense.

In the seventh section it is provided that the by-laws be read to each candidate the first night of his being made or entered previously to initiation, or entering, if required for his approbation.

This is supplemented by the 24th section, which provides that every candidate shall be entitled to a view of the by-laws, and if on examination he does not approve of said laws he shall be dismissed without expense.

The twenty-sixth section provides that the necessary expenses of the Brethren, incurred at the stated lodge night, shall be defrayed by the attending brothers; that visiting brethren are free of expense the first night. The second visit and all others, they shall pay seventy-five cents. (Note: These meetings were of a social nature and the moneys were used by the stewards for lunch and other refreshments.)

Elections were provided for twice a year, on the night next before the days of St. John the Evangelist (Dec. 27) and St. John the Baptist. (June 24).

"All Brethren who have paid up their fines and dues, or have been excused from payments, have the privilege of voting."

By the twenty-ninth section, "a lodge of Emergency may be called to confer the Degrees upon a candidate whose time is uncertain by reason of his leaving the community. The candidate must pay the expense of the night, exclusive of the lodge dues." The fees for the degrees were Twenty Dollars, and one dollar to the Tyler.

"Any member who shall be deemed worthy by the Lodge," so the 32nd section provides, "shall on his going abroad be entitled to receive a certificate from the lodge on paying his dues, and in case of his return must deposit the same on the pedestal before he can take his seat and be considered a member again. This certificate is to be delivered to him when circumstances make it necessary."

After each name signed on the register appears

the highest degree which the member had received.

At a meeting on December 7, 1805, the Worshipful Master was requested to write General Rufus Putnam, and the officers of Lodge No. 1 at Marietta, and James Kilbourne at Worthington, requesting their attendance at the festival of St. John the Evangelist to assist in the installation of the officers.

The first formal meeting of the lodge on November 22, 1805 and apparently other regular meetings previous to the year 1809 were held in the house of Thomas Needham. Thomas Needham was a tavern keeper and in Volume 4 page 403-404 of the Ross County, Ohio, Record of Deeds there is recorded the deed and transfer of lot 258 in the city of Chillicothe from William Keys and Wife to Thomas Needham on September 15, 1804. Lot 258 is located on the Northwest corner of Water Street and Masonic Alley and extends north to Front or Market Street as shown on the original Plat of the City of Chillicothe as recorded in Volume 2, page 94 of the Ross County, Ohio Deeds Records. Photostatic copies of the above records were secured by Brother Cecil S. Blair and are on file in the records of the lodge.

The first candidate raised in Scioto Lodge was Seth Thompson on December 25, 1805. The record does not show where he obtained the first two degrees. This candidate was elected the first Junior Deacon of the lodge on the preceding December 4, 1805 meeting.

Thomas Needham was the first candidate initiated into Scioto Lodge No. 2 on March 19, 1806. He was also the second candidate raised and at his raising he became the 15th member of Scioto Lodge on January 12, 1807.

Candidates were considered entitled to vote as soon as they received the first degree and most business was transacted in the entered apprentice degree until October 2, 1822. At that time the question was raised as to whether Entered Apprentices and Fellow Crafts have the right to vote on any question. This was answered in the negative, and from that time a limitation was placed on those who had not received all three of the degrees.

At the meeting of December 27, 1805, for the celebration of St. John's Day, the minutes record:—

"A procession was formed from the lodge room accompanied by an elegant band of music, which proceeded to the house of Thomas Needham where, after a refreshment the brethren walked to the State House and an oration was delivered by brother George Todd." (of Erie No. 3)

The two festivals of the Sts. John were regularly celebrated, not only at this time, but for many years thereafter. Usually a speech was delivered by some

prominent orator, and there was a banquet, either before or after the speech. It is interesting to note that The Ross County Historical Museum has preserved a Ticket to a Masonic Ball, held in the House of Thomas Needham on December 27, 1809. The ticket was originally the property of Miss Crouse who attended that ball. Apparently the House of Thomas Needham was somewhat larger than might have been expected of a Tavern of that era. Nearly always the brethren paraded from their lodge room, either to the State House, or in some later years to one of the churches in the city. The early references being to the Presbyterian Church, which at that time was located on East Second Street beyond Mulberry, where the Welch Foundry was located in after years. Later they attended the Methodist Church, which was located on West Second Street across from the Elks Hall.

On the 24th of June 1806 (St. John's Day) reference is made to a communication from the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, and the appointment of a proxy to attend the meeting of that Grand Lodge.

During the early years numerous candidates were received in the order. Among the names appear many prominent in the State. From the record as it appears however, we believe that there are no grounds for the statement made in some accounts that, "there is every reason to believe that some Indians were active members of Scioto Lodge." Among the prominent members of early years the following names merit special mention:

Nathaniel Willis was a Charter Member of Scioto Lodge No. 2 and the first Junior Warden. Brother Willis was also the first Proprietor of the Chillicothe Gazette. According to the History of Freemasonry in Ohio this is the same Nathaniel Willis who, along with Paul Revere and several other brethren, dressed themselves in Indian costumes and threw some tea into Boston Harbor on the night of December 16, 1773. Peter Parcells and James Barnes were raised in Scioto Lodge during 1807 and were the second and third proprietors successively of the Scioto Gazette.

Thomas Kirker of West Union was also raised during the year 1807. He was the second Governor of Ohio serving in 1807 and 1808. Thomas Worthington the Governor of Ohio in 1814-1818 was admitted a member of Scioto Lodge in 1815. Duncan McArthur, the Governor of Ohio in 1830-1832 was raised in Scioto Lodge in 1807.

Nathaniel Massie, who first laid out the city of Chillicothe, was admitted a member in 1806. Thomas Gibson, the first Master of Scioto Lodge was Auditor of the Territory and a Royal Arch Mason. William

Creighton, the first Secretary of State of Ohio, was raised in Scioto Lodge in 1807 and was Master in 1819. It was this brother who proposed and designed the Great Seal of Ohio.

Brother Henry Brush, a prominent Judge and Congressman, was raised in Scioto Lodge in 1808. He became Master of the Lodge in 1809 and Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1813 through 1817. Brother Philemon Beecher, later of Lancaster, was also a prominent Judge and Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1817. He had served as Grand Treasurer in 1810-11-12 and was raised in Scioto Lodge in 1807. Another brother who later moved to Lancaster was William W. Irwin who was raised in Scioto Lodge in 1807. This brother was a prominent Lawyer and became the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1825.

Levin Belt, the first Mayor of Chillicothe was raised in Scioto Lodge in 1807, Master of the Lodge in 1818 and Grand Junior Warden of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1813 and 1814. Jeremiah McLene was Sheriff, County Recorder, a member of the first Town Council and Grand Marshall of the Grand Lodge in 1816 through 1818. John Woodbridge, Cashier of the Chillicothe Bank was raised in 1808 and became Grand Marshall of the Grand Lodge in 1811 and 1812.

John Carlisle, prominent merchant was raised in 1808. David Kinkead, prominent merchant was raised in 1808 and held the office of Grand Treasurer of the Grand Lodge from 1813 to 1817. Robert Kercheval, who was raised in Scioto Lodge in 1810 was Secretary of The Grand Lodge from 1813 to 1817. Jacob Burnet was admitted a member of Scioto Lodge in 1810. He was Deputy Grand Master of The Grand Lodge in 1810-1811-1812 and was Grand Orator in 1815.

Thomas Orr, a young man of 22 years from Londonderry, Ireland and a prominent lawyer was raised in Scioto Lodge in 1808. He served the lodge as secretary 7 years, as Master 4 years and was elected to lodge office on at least 18 occasions. He was the second brother to serve all 4 bodies of the York Rite as presiding officer and was especially active as an officer of the Council and as Principal Sojourner of the Chapter. Later he served as a judge of the Supreme Court of Ohio.

Lincoln Goodale received the first two degrees in Scioto Lodge in 1808. It is presumed that he was raised in New England Lodge No. 4, Worthington, because he was a Charter Member of Columbus Lodge No. 30 in 1815 and later, starting in 1818, served the Grand Lodge of Ohio as Treasurer for 19 years. He was also Grand Treasurer of the Grand Chapter of Ohio for that same span of years. Another Charter

Member of Columbus Lodge No. 30 was John Kerr, who was raised in Scioto Lodge on December 6, 1808. He was said to be a merchant and one of the original Proprietors of Columbus. (Wm. Southward)

MASONRY IN OHIO IN 1805.

At the time Scioto Lodge No. 2 was chartered by the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, there were six other lodges already working in the newly organized State of Ohio. A brief Summary of these lodges and their origins follow:—

American Union Lodge No. 1 was chartered by Richard Gridley, Deputy Grand Master of St. John's Provincial Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, on February 15, 1776. It was at that time a Military Lodge without a fixed meeting place. On June 28, 1790 American Union Lodge established a permanent location at Marietta, Ohio. This lodge was recognized by communication from Moses H. Hayes, the Grand Master of Massachusetts on December 6, 1791. The Charter for this lodge was destroyed by fire on March 22, 1801 and, after having failed to have a new charter issued by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, a dispensation was issued, on January 1, 1804 by the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, to enable American Union Lodge to operate until such time as a Grand Lodge should be formed in Ohio. Brother Rufus Putnam of this lodge was elected first Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1808. This lodge was not chartered by the Grand Lodge of Ohio until 1816 because it refused to surrender its dispensation until that time.

Mingo Lodge No. 78 was issued a warrant, by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, on March 4, 1799 to hold a lodge at Old Mingo Town, 3 miles below the present city of Steubenville, Ohio. This lodge was organized on May 21, 1799 and continued to operate until 1806. It was unheard from after that date.

Nova Cesarea Lodge No. 10 was warranted by the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of New Jersey on September 8, 1791 and organized as a lodge on December 27, 1794. Nova Cesarea Lodge No. 10 continued to operate until December 10, 1805, at which time it turned in its warrant to the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of New Jersey and accepted a dispensation from the Grand Lodge of Kentucky. It operated under this dispensation as Cincinnati Lodge No. 13 until December 7, 1808, when they resolved to return their dispensation to the Grand Lodge of Kentucky and to procure a dispensation from the Grand Lodge of Ohio. Meanwhile a group from this lodge petitioned for the return of their warrant from the Grand

Lodge of New Jersey. This petition was not granted. Subsequently both Cincinnati groups joined in the formation of the Grand Lodge of Ohio and became known as Nova Cesarea Harmony Lodge No. 2.

Erie Lodge No. 47 of Warren, Trumbull County, Ohio, was chartered by the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Connecticut on October 19, 1803. The lodge was organized on March 16, 1804. The representatives of this lodge were the first to propose, by formal correspondence, the organization of the Grand Lodge of Ohio. This lodge became No. 3 under the Grand Lodge of Ohio by accepting a warrant of dispensation on March 23, 1809 and was chartered on January 5, 1814. Brother Samuel Huntington of this lodge was elected the second Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1809.

New England Lodge No. 48 of Worthington, Ohio was chartered by the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Connecticut on October 19, 1803. It was represented at the convention forming the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1808 but, the credentials of their representative were not in order and the delegate was not permitted to participate in the proceedings. This situation was corrected before the meeting of the Grand Lodge in 1810 and New England Lodge was eventually chartered as No. 4 in 1814.

Amity Lodge No. 105, Zanesville, Ohio was issued a warrant by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania on June 24, 1805. Its first recorded meeting was held on September 26, 1806. This lodge received a dispensation from the Grand Lodge of Ohio on January 26, 1809 and was chartered as No. 5 on January 15, 1812. Brother Lewis Cass of this lodge was elected Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1810-11-12, and was later a Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Michigan and Governor of Michigan in 1813.

On the 3rd of June 1807, a letter from Erie Lodge No. 47, located at Warren, Ohio was received containing a number of resolutions providing for the formation of a Grand Lodge of Ohio. These resolutions were approved by the members of Scioto Lodge, and similar resolutions were adopted. A committee of five members was authorized to correspond with the different lodges in the state. A further committee of two members was appointed whose duty it was to meet with such brethren, as may be appointed by the other lodges, at Chillicothe on the 25th of December next, to form a Grand Lodge. Those named of the committee on Correspondence were:—Levin Belt, Elias Langham, Henrie Massie, William Creighton, and William Seymour. The Delegates were Thomas Gibson and Elias Langham.

The delegates from the six lodges then chartered, met in Chillicothe on January 4, 1808:—

American Union Lodge at Marietta refused to surrender its Charter, and the credentials of New England Lodge not being satisfactory, the other four lodges proceeded to organize the Grand Lodge, and a resolution was adopted providing for the formation of the Grand Lodge with full powers. It was further provided that the first communication be held on the first Monday in January 1809, which will be held at whatever place the legislature of Ohio is in session.

The several lodges were requested to transmit to their respective Grand Lodges, their lodge dues, and request a certificate thereof, and the several charters were to be sent in with these certificates to the Grand Lodge of Ohio, which shall issue new charters to the several lodges, numbering them in order, beginning with the charter of most ancient date.

Officers of the Grand Lodge were then elected. A list of whom are as follows:—

In the minutes of December 10, 1810, appears the order of procession for the celebration of the festival of St. John, the Evangelist, a copy of which follows:—

The minutes of Scioto Lodge contain no record of any action by that lodge requesting the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts for a release of jurisdiction.

The records of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts of date the 13th of June 1808, contains the following entry:

“A letter was received from Scioto Lodge and read by the Grand Secretary, the subject of which being fully discussed, it was on motion, voted, that Scioto Lodge be and hereby is released from their allegiance to this Grand Lodge, and that their dues for Quarterages and Initiates be relinquished that lodge agreeable to their request.”

Scioto Lodge was granted a dispensation on January 26, 1809. As the charters of the lodges were surrendered to the Grand Lodge of Ohio they were marked “Cancelled and held subject to the order of the Grand Lodge.”

The records of the Grand Lodge of Ohio for 1810 shows the following resolution adopted:—

“Resolved, that the Grand Lodge deem it expedient, and for the benefit of Masonry, to recommend to the lodges, under the jurisdiction of this Grand Lodge, not to confer the degree of Past Master, unless on those who have been regularly elected to fill the chair, until the next Grand Communication; nor any of the higher degrees of masonry, in any instance, until that time, that the Grand Lodge may determine the propriety of such procedure, and give further instructions concerning the same.”

When the Master was installed, the Past Masters Degree was always opened. There is nothing in the minutes, however, to show whether this was the actual Past Masters Degree, or the Past Masters Degree as it is known in the Chapter.

At the meeting of the Grand Lodge in 1811, the minutes show a petition presented for a charter for Chillicothe Lodge. This was not however, the petition for Scioto Lodge, but a separate organization. This petition was afterwards withdrawn, and was, as we know, never granted.

In 1811 a committee reported to Scioto Lodge as follows: "Your committee knows of no reprehensible conduct in the Brethren, nor do they find much to applaud—our institution does not at present appear to profess that liberal spirit in its numbers which the principles of masonry requires. Charity is occasionally clouded by Interest – Avarice or Neglect – Brotherly communication, intelligence and counsels, does not they believe, generally subsist in that spirit recognized and hailed by us—as the cement of our Society." Apparently, with or without justice, there were those of that day who were as critical of the fervency of their brothers as some of current times.

As Scioto Lodge grew, the necessity of having some permanent home became apparent to the members, and we find in the minutes of July 15, 1808 that Brother Creighton presented proposals from Brother Fullerton respecting the erection of a Masonic Hall, which was as follows:—

"The subscriber will purchase one half of the East lot of William Winship's Block of lots binding on the alley and Second Street, will build a brick building of forty-eight feet by twenty-five, the first story thereof for the use of the Chillicothe Bank, will leave a passage of eight feet, and in fine compleat the lower story of the house to be the exclusive property of the subscriber, the passage of eight feet excepted—the upper story, when completed for use of the lodge will be deeded by the subscriber to the lodge—The Lodge building the upper story at their own expense."

This the lodge acceded to, and in our deed records we find of record in Volume 8 page 411, a deed from Thomas James and Wife to Thomas M. Bayley for the property on East Second Street, on the site now occupied by the Majestic Theater, the south east quarter of the lot. Said deed carried the following exception; "Except the upper story of the house which is now occupied as a lodge room for the Free Masons and the use of the entry leading to said room, the title to which remains with Thomas James."

This meeting place was used by the members of Scioto Lodge from the time of its erection in 1809 until it was destroyed by the great fire of 1852. It was also the location of most, if not all, of the sessions of the Grand Lodge of Ohio which met in Chillicothe regularly until the year 1818. The meetings of the Grand Lodge were held in Columbus in 1818 and

did not again return to Chillicothe until 1852.

In 1812 the Grand Lodge decided to number the charters to be issued to the Lodges, beginning with number 2 in order of the seniority of their original charters. It will be remembered that American Union Lodge had not, at that time surrendered its charter and did not surrender it until 1816.

Each set of the minutes of Scioto Lodge for 1812 is headed with words "Scioto Lodge No. 2," until the first of April of that year. From then until May 6th there is no number inserted. In the minutes of that evening appears "No. 6" but this had, for some reason, been erased and thereafter until the 12th of July the records show no number. After the 12th of July "No. 6" appears regularly.

A copy of the Charter granted to Scioto Lodge in that year is as follows:

To All the Fraternity to whom these Presents Shall Come, The Grand Lodge of the Most Ancient and Honorable Society of Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Ohio, sends greetings.

Whereas, the brethren of Scioto Lodge No. 2 in compliance with the ordinance and laws of the Grand Lodge, have heretofore surrendered their original Charter, obtained from the Right Worshipful Grand Lodge of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and thereby became entitled to a warrant or Charter from this Grand Lodge.

Therefore, know Ye, that we, the Grand Lodge of Ohio, reposing special trust and confidence in the prudence and fidelity of our beloved brethren of said Scioto Lodge, in pursuance of Said ordinance and laws have granted and by these presents do grant unto the brethren of said Lodge and their successors, our full power and authority, to convene as Masons, within the town of Chillicothe, in the County of Ross and State of Ohio, and we hereby declare the precedence of the said Scioto Lodge in the Grand Lodge, and elsewhere, to commence from the date of afore-said charter, which is on the ninth day of September, 1805.

In testimony whereof, we the Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master and Grand Wardens by virtue of power and authority to us committed, have hereunto set our hands and caused the seal of the Grand Lodge to be affixed at Chillicothe, this 15th day of January, 1812 and of Masonry 5812.

It is to be noted that all of the above signatures except that of the Grand Master are by members of Scioto Lodge. Moreover, all of them were the regularly elected officers of the Grand Lodge except John Woodbridge who was at that time the Worshipful Senior Grand Deacon. Apparently he signed in pro tem capacity in the place of R. W. Jr. Grand Warden, Edward W. Tupper who was a member of Morning Dawn Lodge No. 7, of Gallipolis, Ohio.

On the minutes of December 26, 1812 appears an application for a waiver of jurisdiction for the purpose of forming a lodge at Circleville. Among the first officers of that lodge were five members of Scioto Lodge. Thereafter many such waivers of jurisdiction

were voted upon by members of Scioto Lodge as other lodges were organized within its original jurisdiction.

From the time of organization of Scioto Lodge until 1812 and in most cases even later jurisdiction lines meant very little because of the great distances between lodges. Within the jurisdiction of Scioto Lodge of 1812, have since been established no less than 29 lodges and 6 others have been established sufficiently near those jurisdiction lines to have reduced the jurisdiction of Scioto Lodge at the time they were established.

In order the following lodges affected the jurisdiction lines of Scioto Lodge at the time they were established;--

The war of 1812 seems to have brought considerable activity to Scioto Lodge. Among the points of interest was the fact that mourning was ordered on all of the jewels of the lodge in honor of one of the Past Grand Masters of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, who had died or was killed in the service of that war. Also in the same year, petitions were presented from four residents of Petersburg, Virginia, for degrees. Their names were John Henderson, Shirley Tisdale, John Spratt and Norbern B. Spotswood. The petitioners were accepted and at a regular communication the entered apprentice degree was conferred on them. They were all on their way to service with the army. Later John Henderson returned to become a regular member of the Lodge. After the war the restoration to membership of a number of members of the lodge was requested of the Grand Lodge. Most of these restored members were veterans of that war.

The membership according to different periods of the history is not entirely comparable. For instance, at the beginning all who had received the entered apprentice degree were considered members and entitled to vote. However a member was able with the permission of the lodge to become a quarterly member. That is, due to the distance from his residence or due to the nature of his business he might not be able to attend lodge regularly. In such a case he was excused from regular attendance and paid 25 cents only on the nights he was able to attend lodge. No regular detailed report of membership was made to the Grand Lodge and the actual membership can only be estimated by studying the records of admissions, deaths, demits, etc. On this basis we find an estimated membership comparable to present times amounting to 50 members in 1814. However, in that year an official report was made to the Grand Lodge and the official membership was 26. In that year the official membership of the entire state was estimated to be 635.

In the fall of 1814 Brother Thomas Smith Webb visited Scioto Lodge on at least seven occasions. Thomas Smith Webb is considered to be the father of modern masonry as it is practiced in the United States. This gentleman was responsible for preparing and printing Webb's Monitor in the year 1797. This Monitor was very widely and quite generally used by lodges of that date. It contains the lectures generally used in masonic work in the first half of the nineteenth century. The Monitor covers all of the degrees of the York Rite and copies available at the present time usually have a supplement by E. T. Carson covering all of the degrees of the Scottish Rite.

However, Brother Webb was even better known as an organizer and as a Masonic Instructor. He had

a large part in the organizing of the General Grand Chapter and of the General Grand Encampment of the United States. He personally assisted in the organizing of the Grand Chapter of Ohio and of Mount Vernon Commandery No. 1 of Worthington, Ohio. This Commandery has since been moved to Columbus, Ohio. It is very much suspected that his visit to Chillicothe was for the purpose of organizing a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. In any case Royal Arch Masons and Knights Templar marched with Thomas Smith Webb in the Saint John's Day Parade of Dec. 26, 1814.

The first meeting of Chillicothe Chapter was held on September 12, 1816 at which time the Mark Masters Degree was conferred. The first Royal Arch Degree was conferred on December 24, 1818. The Chapter was chartered on December 12, 1821 by the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Ohio. It is very doubtful if any of the above work was done under the authority of Scioto Lodge because we believe that Scioto Lodge would have complied with the resolution adopted by the Grand Lodge in 1810 and quoted on page 5 of this history.

The work mentioned above was presided over by Henry Brush, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge in 1816 and 1817 and he would certainly have known of the resolution of 1810. He would have also known that the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons was organized in 1816 and would have hesitated to have interfered with their jurisdiction. For this reason it is believed very likely that the chapter work done on September 12, 1816 may have been authorized by a dispensation issued by Thomas Smith Webb acting as a representative of the General Grand Chapter. It must be admitted, however that we have been unable to find any record of such a dispensation.

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons was organized at Worthington, Ohio on October 22, 1816. The only Chapters of Royal Arch Masons which preceded Chillicothe Chapter No. 4 were as follows:

- American Union No. 1, Marietta, Ohio
- Cincinnati No. 2, Cincinnati, Ohio
- Horeb No. 3, Originally of Worthington but now located at Westerville, Ohio

Evidently the membership took part in various amateur theatrical performances, for according to the minutes of Jan. 12, 1815 the secretary was ordered to subscribe to the "Masonic Minstrel."

In 1815 the fee for visitors was fixed at 25 cents after the first meeting. This was a very considerable reduction from the 75 cents required in the original bylaws.

In the early days the hall seems to have been

rented for all kinds of purposes; In 1810 the Appalonia Society was given leave to meet in the hall. In the same year permission was given Monsieur "Duc" to practice with his pupils in fencing. Fairs were held there. The members of the Episcopal Society used the room. The Odd Fellows met in it. Also the members of the Baptist Society and the German Methodist Church.

In 1819 the Grand Lodge installed the officers of the lodge. In the same year it was resolved to exclude all renters, except the Episcopal Society. This was not strictly carried out, as we find the hall used, from time to time for other purposes.

There follow some resolutions of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in the year 1820, for the government of Subordinate Lodges under its jurisdiction.

"Resolved, That no lodge, in the absence of the Masters and Wardens, shall initiate, craft, or raise, unless a past Master is present to preside."

"Resolved, That all applications for initiations, or for membership, shall lie over at least from one regular meeting to another, unless three-fourths of the membership present decide that application to be a case of emergency."

"Resolved, That no subordinate lodge shall confer the degrees of entered apprentice, fellowcraft, and Master Mason on any person for a less sum than fifteen dollars; and a unanimous vote shall be necessary to initiate or advance."

"Resolved, That each subordinate lodge shall pay to the Grand Lodge at each Annual Communication, fifty cents for each initiation, and twenty-five cents for each member belonging thereto."

"Resolved, That no subordinate lodge shall hereafter take notes of hand for fees, or grant any time of credit therefor."

Here we see the beginning of many of our present day masonic laws, similar but not exactly the same as those by which we are governed today.

In the early years the steward actually provided the refreshments of various kinds, and the celebrations of St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist seem to have been the occasion for not only speech making but also for banquets and parades. Many of them started or ended at a tavern. Bands were hired to take part in the processions, some of them coming from as far as Worthington. On one occasion the steward's bill presented to the lodge for payment, reported that he had furnished 4 pounds of cheese, two gallons of cider and \$1.75 worth of cakes and crackers. Evidently refreshment was used to too great an extent, and steps were taken to stop it. The minutes of July 6, 1820 show the adoption of a resolution not to use any of the dues of the lodge for

refreshments. This action slightly anticipated the following:

In 1821 the committee on the report of the Grand Lecturer reported to the Grand Lodge as follows: "It is evident that many, if not all the lodges, are too much in the practice of indulging in excessive and sumptuous refreshments, thereby in a great degree impairing their ability to perform those charitable acts which ever have been regarded as the fundamental and primary principles of our Masonic Superstructure. From a view of the whole report, the committee are induced to recommend to the Grand Lodge the adoption of the following resolutions:

1. Resolved, that and Lodges be cited to appear, by their proper officers, before the Grand Lodge at its next Annual Communication, and show why their respective charters should not be declared forfeited.

2. Resolved, that the Master of and the Treasurer of be summoned to appear before the Grand Lodge at its next annual session, and show cause why they should not be dealt with for their contumacious and unmasonic conduct toward the Grand Lecturer, when in the discharge of his duties as such.

3. Resolved, That some suitable person or persons be appointed to receive the jewels and effects of and Lodges on behalf of the Grand Lodge, and dispose of them in such manner as shall be most conducive to the interest of the fraternity.

4. Resolved, That the Grand Lodge do recommend to the subordinate lodges within its jurisdiction the discontinuance of refreshments.

Following this action there was a general but unsuccessful movement to abolish the office of Grand Lecturer.

Edward King was raised in Scioto Lodge on December 26, 1820. This brother must have been a very proficient student of the art as well as a shining light in the legal profession. He became High Priest of Chillicothe Chapter in 1822 and Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Ohio in 1824.

On July 6, 1826 a petition was received by the Grand Lodge of Ohio for the formation of a new lodge in Chillicothe. This was the second attempt to form a competing lodge and was recommended favorably by Scioto Lodge. The following names were signed to this petition:

T. W. Swearingen, J. S. Swearingen, John Hunter, John Hays, Joseph McCutcheon, Thomas Scott, and A. A. Hawks. All of these petitioners were members of Scioto Lodge except T. W. Swearingen and John Hunter. The lodge was never organized.

Hard times must have been affecting the residents of this state in 1825, for The Grand Lodge remitted the dues from all of the lodges under its jurisdiction, that the subordinate lodges might use the money for charitable purposes. However, it was also a memorable year in the history of the order, because it was during that year that two very distinguished masons visited the state. The first of these was General Lafayette and he was expected to visit Chillicothe. The records show that at the meeting of April 7, 1825, a committee composed of Brothers Gates, Martin, and King were named to confer with a committee from the chapter to make arrangements for the reception of Lafayette. For some reason the General never reached Chillicothe.

The following July this same committee were named to make similar arrangements for the reception of DeWitt Clinton, Governor of New York State. Governor Clinton was very much interested in the building of canals. He was instrumental in the construction of the Erie Canal in New York and this led him to visit Ohio where the Ohio Erie Canal went under construction in 1825.

The Governor visited here on the 25th of July, was duly received in the lodge room, and made an elegant and instructive address to those present. The records show that forty-nine were present at the meeting. The banquet was served to all for the sum of \$13.50. We wonder what they had to eat and drink. It is interesting to note that Governor Clinton was the first Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States. He was also one of the most outspoken members of the fraternity during the beginnings of the Anti-Masonic period from 1826 to 1828. Clinton died in 1828 and many feel that if this man had lived, his tremendous influence and zeal for the fraternity would have stopped this movement completely.

As it was, the death or disappearance of William Morgan was used by the enemies of the fraternity for political purposes. Lodges closed, temples were burned and the greatest crisis in the history of the fraternity made it necessary for Freemasonry to go under ground. The history of these events is well recorded and we only mention them here because we must record how these events affected the operation of Scioto Lodge.

Chillicothe Council was organized on January 18, 1828. The Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of the State of Ohio was organized at Worthington on January 6, 1830. The only Councils of Royal and Select Masters which were organized previous to Chillicothe Council No. 4 were:—

Cincinnati No. 1, on October 24, 1827

Stuebenville No. 2, on October 27, 1827

Adoniram No. 3, Granville, on January 1, 1828

Lancaster No. 4, on January 11, 1828

The council at Granville was dropped in 1837 and the Councils were renumbered in 1850 when Chillicothe Council received No. 4 and Lancaster Council received No. 3. In 1882 the Charter of Lancaster Council was annulled and a new Council No. 88 was organized in Lancaster in 1902. Chillicothe Council is therefore the 3rd oldest continuously authorized Council in Ohio. Henry Brush was the first Master of Chillicothe Council. James Gates served two years as deputy Grand Master and one year as Grand Principal Conductor of the work. William Emmitt served as Grand Principal conductor of the work for one year. James Caldwell served as Grand Recorder from January 6, 1831 to October 25, 1844. These were all members of Scioto Lodge.

With such activities as these we might think that masonry moved on, with confidence, unaware of the serious conflict which had closed the doors of the fraternity in most of the eastern states. But the Anti Masonic Period did not leave Scioto Lodge or the Grand Lodge of Ohio entirely unscathed. Scioto Lodge closed its doors and remained dark during 1832 and 1833. One meeting only was held in 1834 for the purpose of electing officers. In 1835 and 1836 the lodge was again dark—no meetings—no work.

In 1837 the lodge came back to life. At the first meeting in that year, held on June 6, James D. Caldwell became a member of Scioto Lodge by admission. He was also elected Master of Scioto Lodge at that meeting. This man is probably the most distinguished mason ever to be a member of Scioto Lodge.

Brother Caldwell came from Baltimore, Maryland, where he had married; while enjoying his bridal tour he was captured by the British and was held prisoner on the Man of War with Francis Scott Key, during the bombardment of Fort McHenry, Baltimore, at which time the latter wrote the Star Spangled Banner, and presented a copy of it to Mrs. Caldwell. In 1823 Brother Caldwell became Master of Amity Lodge No. 5 at Zanesville, Ohio. It is understood that he later was a member of Pickaway Lodge No. 23 at Circleville, Ohio. This brother was Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Ohio from 1836 to 1843 inclusive, Grand Secretary of the Grand Chapter of Ohio in those same years and Grand Recorder of the Grand Council of Ohio from Jan. 6, 1831 to Oct. 25, 1844. He was Master of Scioto Lodge for 1837-39-40-42-43, and 44. He was Senior Deacon in 1846. He was High Priest of Chillicothe Chapter in 1839 through 1844 inclusive, Master of

Chillicothe Council in the same years and became the first brother to preside over all masonic bodies in Chillicothe by presiding over Chillicothe Commandery in 1847. He died in Zanesville on March 30, 1861 at which time he was recognized as Grand Steward of the Grand Lodge of Ohio.

Chillicothe Commandery is the only Chillicothe Masonic Body which did not antedate the organization of the corresponding Grand Body of Ohio. Brother James D. Caldwell was present when the Grand Commandery was organized in Lancaster on October 24, 1843. The following Commanderies were represented officially at that meeting:—

In 1839-40-41-42 the Grand Lodge attempted the construction of a building for use during their annual meetings. This had been agitated almost from the beginning and as a matter of fact was to continue for many years after this date. Quite a number of different cities presented bids for the location of the building. Among those cities Chillicothe was a prominent contender. At this particular time however Lancaster was definitely accepted as the site, and all of the lodges were asked to subscribe money for the purpose of erecting the building.

Scioto Lodge in 1842 subscribed \$600 for that purpose. Contracts were let by the Grand Lodge for the new building, but the money for the subscriptions were not paid and after digging the foundation, and having part of the walls of the foundation erected, the matter seems to have lost impetus and was finally abandoned at considerable cost to the Grand Lodge.

In 1844, the by-laws of Scioto Lodge were changed to make no one eligible for Master of the Lodge who had not served as a Warden. At the same time the lodge ruled that all business other than the conferring of degrees and examinations should be conducted in the Master Mason's Degree. In February 1844, the lodge purchased two air tight

stoves to heat the lodge room. The cost of these stoves was \$12.50 each plus the pipe and installation charges for a total cost of \$27.09. In May of 1844, no lodge meeting was held because someone had stolen the door key from the Tyler.

In the History of Scioto Lodge written by Hamill, Scholl and Evans in 1936 appears the following statement. "We wonder how many of the members of Scioto Lodge today know that Scioto Lodge and Chillicothe Chapter own two lots on Grandview Cemetery, and that there are several burials on these lots." "The Chillicothe Cemetery Company, which operates Grandview Cemetery, was organized in 1845, and the lots were purchased in 1847."

Apparently our historians of that day overlooked the records of Scioto Lodge for 1865 and 1871 because we find that on June 1, 1865 a committee consisting of Brother Safford, Waddle and Klein were appointed "to select a cemetery lot on the hill, for the burial of visiting brothers dying in our midst." And at the meeting of January 4, 1872 the lodge voted to pay \$150 for part payment on the lot. The balance was voted on March 7, 1872 and the deed was recorded. Also on January 4, 1872, the lodge paid \$5 for the digging of the grave of Brother L. Hubbell. Perhaps Scioto Lodge owns more cemetery lots than we know about. A search of the records at the court house might prove worth while.

Meetings in 1848 were held on the First Thursday and Third Friday of each month.

In 1849, a committee was named to consider the purchase of the lot upon which the Masonic Temple stood at that time. The minutes show the report of the committee, giving the entire history of the title from the laying out of the City of Chillicothe by Nathaniel Massie. The property referred to in this paragraph was located on the Site of the Majestic Theatre on East Second Street. The celebration of St. John's Day in June 1849 was postponed on account of cholera.

In 1850 Scioto Lodge made a contribution to the Washington Monument Memorial Fund. During that year the Grand Lodge of Ohio was responsible for sending a block of Dayton Stone to become a part of the Washington Monument. It is said that they were the first Grand Masonic Body to make such a contribution.

Early in the year 1852, the lodge took out insurance on their newly purchased lodge hall. At that time gas had become available and the lodge ordered pipe and fittings to install gas service. These fittings had been delivered but had not been installed when, on April 1, 1852 the great fire of Chillicothe occurred. One of the first bills presented after the

fire was to collect for these fixtures, and the amount was \$38.00 (4-16-1852.)

The great fire is said to have destroyed all of the town lying between Walnut Street and Mulberry Street and from Water Street to Main Street except the South Eastern Quarter Block to the Western Side of Paint Street. This fire started on the west side of Walnut Street between Water and Second Street. The Masonic Temple was a total loss but no records were destroyed. There remained however only a single volume of a sizeable Masonic Library (Olivers Historical Landmarks and Antiquities of Masonry.)

Help came at once, not only from other Masonic Bodies, but other fraternal bodies in the city. The Odd Fellows at once opened their hall for the use of Scioto Lodge until such time as a new building could be erected. At the first meeting after the fire, on the 9th of April, a committee was appointed for the purpose of rebuilding the building. Temporary quarters were rented from Mr. Carlisle. These quarters were located in the Carlisle Building on the South Eastern corner of Paint and Main Streets.

The losses of the members of the order, as individuals, was given as \$35,350 over and above the amount of the insurance that they carried. Contributions poured in from all over the state, for the relief of those suffering losses from the fire. The Grand Lodge remitted the dues of Scioto Lodge for the year 1852. Subscription lists were opened, not only for the assistance of the members who suffered serious losses by reason of the fire, but also for the purpose of rebuilding the Masonic Temple. The amount subscribed for the assistance of the brethren was \$967.50 and the subscriptions for the Masonic Building amounted to \$5,274.50. It appears that the sudden receipt of these contributions caused the lodge, temporarily, to feel that they could spare some cash for investment purposes because the records show that on July 9, 1852 they made a loan amounting to \$1400 to Brother T. P. Hurst with good security and at an interest rate of 8 per cent.

The building committee was composed of Brothers Orr, Massie and Phillips. The cost of the new building according to the bids received, was \$10,000 and the contract was awarded to Watt and Phillips.

The Grand Lodge requested the privilege of meeting in Chillicothe in 1852. There were some objections due to a complete lack of public housing. Finally, however, the lodge was able to secure housing by private solicitation from the entire population. The records show that accommodations for 463 persons was secured as follows:—

First Ward - 79; Second Ward - 157; Third Ward - 145; Fourth Ward - 82. This appears to be a shining

example of cooperation by persons not directly concerned with the affairs of the Lodge because the Lodge had only 53 members at that time.

Before actual construction was hardly under way Mr. Watt withdrew (6-2-1853) from the contracting firm and left the completion of the contract entirely in the hands of Brother George Washington Phillips who had been raised on February 6, 1851.

The Grand Lodge meeting of October 19, 1852 was held in Atheneum Hall, located on the North West corner of Walnut and Second Streets, with 157 lodges represented by 406 voting members. At this meeting, the officers and members of Scioto Lodge offered to construct a building sufficient for the meetings of the Grand Lodge and also to provide committee and Library Rooms and a Fire-Proof Vault for the preservation of the archives. Probably remembering the recent collapse of a similar enterprise at Lancaster, the Grand Lodge took no action on the suggestion.

The Grand Lodge met in special session on June 3, 1853, when the corner stone was laid by Most Worshipful William B. Hubbard, Grand Master. The work must have advanced very rapidly because on October 18, 1853 the Grand Lodge met in the new Masonic Temple. At its adjourned meeting held on October 19, 1853 the following communication was received and read:—

Chillicothe, Ohio
October 18, 1853

Dear Sir:

The Marietta and Cincinnati Railroad Company, having considerable portion of their road graded, and on which the iron is now being laid, have in contemplation the immediate construction of such depot buildings as will soon be necessary for the accommodation of their business.

As this is a work of great magnitude and of general interest, aiming at an uninterrupted connection between the cities of the East and those of the West, and thereby drawing closer the bonds of social union, it would be a source of gratification to all, and especially to those of the brotherhood interested and engaged in the enterprise, if you, sir, as Grand Master of the Order of Free and Accepted Masons in the State of Ohio, will consent to lay the corner stone of our depot in Chillicothe, now ready to be commenced. The time to be designated by yourself.

With the hope that you will consider the matter favorably, we are, Sir,

Yours most respectfully,

J. Madeira, Treas.

A. Kennedy, Eng. M&C.R.R.

To Wm. B. Hubbard, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio.

Thursday afternoon, October 20th, the Grand Lodge under the direction of the Grand Marshall, Brother McMakin, proceeded to the depot, and there the corner stone of the new station was laid by Most Worshipful William B. Hubbard, Grand Master.

The records state:—

“These ceremonies being completed, the fraternity accepted the polite invitation of the company, and enjoyed a pleasant ride of some ten miles over their road.”

The Grand Lodge loaned to Scioto Lodge the sum of \$4000 to assist them in rebuilding their Lodge quarters, and in addition \$2000 was borrowed from Mr. Ross who owned the adjoining lot. The building was dedicated on the 24th of June 1854. The first meeting was held in the new hall on the 2nd of November 1854. The Grand Lodge, through its officers, conducted this ceremony. M. Z. Kreider was then the Most Worshipful Grand Master, and Brother Hempstead of Portsmouth acted as Grand Orator.

A mortgage was given to the Grand Lodge the same year for \$4000. This mortgage, and the one to Mr. Ross caused the lodge a great deal of financial difficulty, and resulted in the building finally being deeded over to the Grand Lodge for the consideration of the cancellation of their mortgage, and the assumption by the Grand Lodge of the debt to Mr. Ross. The deed was dated the 23rd of April, 1861, and names as the consideration therefor the sum of \$5000.

In 1865, however, the Grand Lodge reconveyed the property to Ferdinand Tritscheller (Treasurer of Scioto Lodge) for the express consideration of \$2600.

Ferdinand Tritscheller died shortly thereafter, and George D. Schaffer, acting as administrator, on the 29th of November, 1866, reconveyed the property to Scioto Lodge for the express consideration of \$3067. As a matter of fact Scioto Lodge paid off the money due to the Grand Lodge, as well as that due to the Ross Estate, during the period of prosperity following the Civil War.

On July 30, 1854, when one of the candidates for the degrees was being questioned, he denied the divine origin of the Scriptures. This caused quite a discussion. However, this subject was a matter for discussion by the Grand Lodge in 1820-1824 and also during 1854 and on later occasions. Generally it can be stated that belief in the divine origin of the Scriptures was a requirement of the Grand Lodge of that period. Of course this is no longer a requirement because at present belief in God and possession of a good moral character are the only specific requirements for membership. Indeed even in very early times non Christians, but believers in a Supreme

Being were admitted to membership in other Grand Jurisdictions.

At this time and for some time thereafter problems relating to sectarian beliefs were somewhat common. Happily they have been resolved on the basis of the Brotherhood of man and the Fatherhood of God. At this time the fraternity was concerned with co-masonry—(the conferring of so called masonic degrees upon women.) This was declared to be a fraud upon the women and an illegal clandestine performance in which masons should not be involved.

On the 5th of June, 1855, at the request of Scioto Lodge, in response to an invitation from the Ross County Commissioners, the Grand Master accepted the invitation to lay the corner stone of the new court house, which was accordingly done on the 15th of July that same year. The Grand Lodge or its representatives also laid the cornerstone of several other well known buildings. Among them were the following:—

City Building, September 18, 1874, Matt H. Watt representing the Most Worshipful Grand Master Asa H. Battin.

Walnut Street M. E. Church, September 22, 1903, Most Worshipful W. A. Belt, Grand Master, Presiding.

JOHN PORTER BROWN.

On the 5th of December, 1850 a dispensation was granted, by the Grand Lodge of Ohio, to Scioto Lodge to confer all of the degrees upon John Porter Brown and Emir Bey. John Porter Brown (son of George Brown, raised Scioto Lodge 7-21-1807) was the representative of the United States in the Port of Constantinople, and Emir Bey was one of the attaches. They were on a visit to this country. Brown had stated that he would bring and present to Scioto Lodge a stone from King Solomon's Temple and a portion of one of the cedars of Lebanon. Emir Bey did not appear, but on December 5, 1850 the Entered Apprentice and Fellowcraft Degrees were conferred on John Porter Brown. The Candidate was then raised on December 7, 1850.

On January 1, 1857, the block of marble was received from John Porter Brown, and that and a piece of the cedar of Lebanon are still part of the valued possessions of Scioto Lodge. The Cedar of Lebanon was received on May 9, 1857. Brother Brown also secured a certificate from the Turkish Government certifying that these objects were authentic.

From time to time word was received of the activities of John Porter Brown, usually through Brother John Madeira who was related by marriage to Brother Brown. Later Brother Brown transferred his member-

ship from Scioto Lodge, and became a member of one of the lodges at Constantinople. In 1857, the block of marble presented by Brother Brown was cut in two and one half given away by a trusted member of Scioto Lodge. The missing half was never recovered.

There follows a Speech by John Porter Brown made at Constantinople and sent to Scioto Lodge by way of Brother John Madeira; Read and reported on the records of April 3, 1860:

"I feel extremely grateful for the flattering manner in which my health has been proposed this evening and for evidence of kind feeling with which it has been drank by the brethren present. I cannot too warmly express the pleasure and satisfaction which I derive from being one of the Masonic order, which has brought together tonight representations from so many parts of the work of the Grand Architect. If I sought for sources of commendation for the mystic tie to which we all have taken vows of fidelity, I certainly could find them in the various nationalities surrounding me. Masonry has here brought together and united in one band of fraternity, the Ottoman and the Persian, the Briton and the American, the Frenchman and the Italian, the German and the Swede, the Nations of the East, the land where the sun rises, meets as a brother with the nations of the west, where he sets and I might almost say that the two poles, two frigid zones are here joined in one band of warm fraternity. So must it ever be where the principles of true masonry are carried out and Masons meet together as brothers. National and other prejudices are forgotten and Masons meet as the children of one common parent, the Great Architect of the Universe.

"I have the impression that many years ago there was a French Lodge in Pera in Galaba, which for reasons unknown to me has long ceased to exist. The present Oriental Lodge only dates back three years and yet it already contains some seventy members. There is also a French Lodge in Pera recently warranted by the Grand Orient of France called "L'Etoile du Bosphorus", represented here this evening by some worthy brethren and contains about fifty members and a German Lodge is in contemplation.

"It is believed that the fraternity in Smyrna numbering I am told several hundred will be favored with a warrant from the Grand Lodge of England and beyond these I am not aware that there exists any other Masonic Association in Turkey. Indeed the very name of Mason in Turkish "Ferr Mason", is used as a word of reproach here on account, of course, of a total ignorance amongst Musselmen of its real significance. I remember some years ago, when in Trelizonde to have been told that the worst epithet which

the people there gave to foreigners were Protestant, Moscov, Ferr Mason and Consolos. I believe I have named them conformably with their several degrees of indignity, and verily believe that the same is even now in vogue in the vocabularies of many of the inhabitants of this capitol.

"It would be very desirable that the real objects and principles of Free Masonry were better known in this country. Their liberality towards all those who are not pagans, their non-exclusiveness towards all sects, Israelite, Christian and Musselman and the fraternal good will and friendship which they inculcate could not but impress Mohammedans with a favorable conviction.

"Masonry is being introduced into Persia under the very favorable auspices of Past Grand Master Khan and others of distinction and I regard the lodges in this capitol of the Musselman world as a strong means of allaying those religious prejudices which so unfortunately separate the East from the West, and as a mans of spreading that Masonic Light and Love and good will among men which shone forth originally from the East.

"In common with several others of the brethren present I have indulged in the impression that Masonry existed amongst the Musselmen of Turkey, especially in Constantinople and have made diligent research for some trace of it, I regret to have to add without any success. I even have heard that there were lodges in Stamboul, Scutary, Salivira and Adrianople and that even the Grand Lodge existed in secret in the lake of Tiberias, where it had been taken during the disaster which befell the Holy City of David and the destruction of the Temple of Solomon. There are, it is true, a few Masons amongst the employees of the Ottman government, some of them high in rank, but they have all become such in Europe.

"If I am not detaining you too long, I will add that, I have been led to make a particular study of the principles of some of the various Dervish sects, existing in the East, in the hope of finding there an affinity to Freemasonry. These differ but little from each other except in form of their worship and I have not found any trace whatever of that benevolence and charity to others which characterizes and ornaments our fraternal order. I believe, from all that I have learned, that all of the Dervish sects are strictly Musselman with no other object in view than the observance of some particular form of worship under the direction of a Sheik or Master and that the principles are in all cases Islam, either Cheyee or Sunnar (mostly the former) and that as I have first said Benevolence to others forms no part of their creed. One, perhaps the purest of these sects, is the

Hamsavees named like the others from its founder and formerly known as the Melamizim, and if their principles are not of a benevolent and charitable character they certainly teach a pure and correct and upright line of conduct which would command the respect of any Masonic body.

Let us brethren, be animated by that characteristic of the most ancient order, Freemasonry, Charity toward each others faults and weakness, and benevolence toward the unhappy, the poor, the miserable and the wretched—without asking or caring to know the cause of their sorrow or whether they be Protestant or Catholic, Mahommedan or Greek, Armenian or Israelite, but simply because they are all the children of our common Parent, The Great Architect of the Universe.”

FINIS

The above seems to be very informative of the situation of the fraternity in Asia Minor in the year 1860, and of the character of our Brother Brown.

About 1863 some papers accompanying the gift of the piece of cedar from John Porter Brown disappeared. A committee was named, in 1864, to search for the papers. The matter was quietly dropped later, because it involved certain members of the lodge in a rather unfortunate way. However, the papers were returned on December 7, 1865.

It would appear that Scioto Lodge did not have much success guarding these treasures from the hands of its trusted servants.

On February 3, 1879, John Porter Brown, through A. C. Ireland of this city presented to the lodge a copy of the “Levant Times” of Date, December 17, 1869. This contained a notice that he, John Porter Brown, had been appointed District Deputy Grand Master of Turkey, by the Grand Lodge of England.

In 1872, notice was received of the death of John Porter Brown, but no date was given. It was later determined to be April 27, 1872.

It is probable that in the rebuilding of the Temple, in 1853, provision was made for gas service but that detail does not seem clear from the records. In 1857 the lodge considered putting a carpet on the floor, but instead ordered the Tan Bark, Thereon, removed and sand substituted.

About this time James Emmitt was exerting a strong influence upon the development of Southern Ohio. He assisted in the building of the Ohio and Erie Canal, and also the turnpike from Portsmouth to Columbus. Piketon was the county seat of Pike County, but James Emmitt, for personal reasons, wanted the county seat moved to Waverly. The Legislature caused this to be done. This resulted in a request

for Orient Lodge to be transferred to Waverly with the consent of adjoining lodges. The Grand Lodge agreed to the transfer on November 6, 1862.

There was very little activity in Scioto Lodge from 1858 to 1863. In the years 1864 to 1869 a post war boom appears to have hit the lodge with many candidates and the reinstatement of returned soldiers.

On January 7, 1863, Brother Charles L. Franklin turned over to the lodge the Jewel of the Secretary of Cormio Lodge of Kingston, North Carolina. This jewel was taken in a raid on that city and found in the possession of a Naval Officer, not a mason. It was preserved by Scioto Lodge until the owner could be found and was ordered returned on February 1, 1866.

On July 1, 1864, Brother William B. Mills was buried with cooperation between the Odd Fellows and the Masonic Lodge. One half of the pall bearers were from each body. It appears that this is rather an unusual circumstance because we find no other occasion when similar detail was reported.

Up to this time the much enjoyed banquets, social sessions, parades, bands and speeches by orators seem to have been more or less reserved for men only. After the Civil War period the ladies were invited to take part in the different affairs, including the Festival of the Saints John. The records contain frequent notes of banquets at which the ladies were present and a good time was had by all. The first big affair of this kind appears to have been held in January, 1869, shortly after the repurchase of the building. They not only had a fair, but also a supper, concert, music and Tableaux, and charged one dollar admission. A similar but smaller party was held in Greenfield on June 24, 1867. On that occasion Scioto Lodge and the Knights Templar took part together with their families.

On February 3rd and 4th, 1868, St. Peter’s Roman Catholic Church rented the Masonic Hall. The rent amounting to \$10 was refunded to the church.

In 1869 there was a movement for the formation of a home for unfortunates. On October 6, 1870, Scioto Lodge made a pledge of a sizeable annual contribution for this purpose and for a period of five years, with the provision that, “if accepted the Grand Lodge shall not assess or raise Grand Lodge Dues for this purpose.” At this time there appear requests for charity at almost every meeting of the lodge.

On May 5, 1870 the lodge was requested to be present and conduct the ceremony of re-enterrment of the remains of General Nathaniel Massie on Grandview Cemetery. The date was set for May 30th. General Nathaniel Massie and his wife were originally buried on the farm owned by the General, which is located on Route 50, a mile west of Bainbridge, and

This building is located on the corner of Masonic Alley and Second Street and is now occupied by the Majestic Theatre. It was built in 1853 and completely remodeled and enlarged in 1876. It was used for Masonic Purposes until the occupation of the present building in 1904. The Masonic Hall, constructed in 1809 and which burned in 1852, occupied this same site.

just west of where the road turns off to West Union. General Massie's remains were re-entered at the North east point of Grandview Cemetery close to the Soldiers Circle, and a monument has been erected at his grave. The ceremony actually took place on June 6. An address was made by Hon. James T. Worthington. The original Tombstones of Massie and his wife are now on view in The Ross County Historical Museum.

The subject of colored lodges has never been a matter of much concern so far as the records of Scioto Lodge reveal. However, the matter has been discussed on very frequent occasions in the Grand Lodge. It is our understanding that such a lodge exists at the present time in Chillicothe, and although not recognized by the Grand Lodge of Ohio, it is probably doing commendable work done among its own members.

About 1873 another period of hard times swept over the country and on December 4, 1873 the lodge voted to offer the use of its hall to the city for charitable programs.

On April 9, 1874 the lodge voted to pay \$10 for 500 copies of the Ross County Masonic Directory. This is the first record of a Masonic Directory that we have been able to find.

On June 4, 1874 the lodge voted the use of their rooms for a banquet for visiting and local newspaper editors which would be held on June 10th.

In the year 1876, began the movement to enlarge the building on East Second Street. The minutes of March 2nd of that year show that Mr. James Welsh made an offer to sell to the Masonic Bodies a strip of ground the width of half a lot, and 15 feet in length, for \$250. This lay at the north end of the property owned by the Masonic Bodies. The proposition was accepted and a deed for the property made. The plans were at once begun for improving the building. The plans were submitted at the meeting of March 15, and approved. The cost of the building was not to exceed Eight Thousand Dollars. Isaiah Lord, John F. Cook, Matt H. Watt, George L. Wolf, and Phillip Klein were named as a committee to have charge of the work.

On May 15, 1876 the lodge voted to mortgage the property to the extent of \$6000 to cover the cost of these improvements. The work was brought to a rapid conclusion. It was some years however, before this expense was finally paid off.

Most of the time during the alterations, the Bodies still met in their building but the minutes disclose that the Odd Fellows tendered to the Masonic Bodies the use of their building while the construction was going on. This invitation was accepted with thanks.

On June 24, 1876, a large number of members of

Scioto Lodge journeyed to Marietta to assist in the celebration of the Centennial of American Union Lodge.

On March 1, 1877, Phillip Klein was presented with a silver water set of 5 pieces as a slight token of appreciation of Masonic Services he had rendered.

On September 5, 1878, the lower hall was offered for the benefit of Yellow Fever Sufferers from the south.

On June 8, 1882, with the consent of the Lodge, Chillicothe Commandery No. 8, entertained her sister commanderies in the Opera House.

On July 6, 1882, a petition for a new lodge to be called Chillicothe Lodge No. — was sent to the Grand Lodge. It was signed by Joseph Smith, William E. Evans, F. M. DeWeese, Samuel Kendrick, Thomas L. Mackey, Edward A. Herzog, William B. Mills, and John F. Cook. All but one of these were members of Scioto Lodge. On August 3, 1882, the motion to adopt the prayer of the petitioners was lost by a vote of 17 in favor and 33 opposed. Most of the petitioners then withdrew from the lodge but most were reinstated in the next year or two and at least two of them later became Master of the Lodge.

On November 26, 1883, the middle Chamber pillars were presented to Scioto Lodge by 15 craftsmen. On December 6, 1883, Opera House Chairs were donated to the lodge by 87 members. On December 6, 1883, the Low Twelve Bell was conceived and executed by F. H. Hopkins and Frank Henn. Also on this date, the marble tops for the pedestals and the gavels for the officers were presented to the lodge by William H. Godfrey of Reliance Lodge, Brooklyn, New York, through the assistance of Brother F. H. Hopkins. William H. Godfrey was made an Honorary Member as a result of this kindness.

On February 16, 1884, the Masonic Bodies of Chillicothe solicited, collected and sent donations to the following lodges to be used for flood relief:— Aurora No. 48, Portsmouth, Ohio; Portsmouth No. 395, Portsmouth, Ohio; Morning Dawn No. 7, Gallipolis, Ohio; Lawrence No. 198, Ironton, Ohio; and the Masonic Relief Association, Cincinnati, Ohio.

Flood crests at Cincinnati, are quoted from the lodge records as follows:—

1832—59 feet 6¼ inches.

1847—58 feet 9¼ inches.

February 15, 1883—66 ft. 4 inches.

February 14, 1884—71 feet ¾ inches.

February 6, 1884—60 feet—February 20, 62 feet being continuously above 60 feet for two weeks. There was only 15 hours difference in the time between the flood crest of 1883 and 1884.

In 1887 Brother Frederick H. Rehwinkel became

Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Ohio. This brother was admitted a member of Scioto Lodge on demit from Aurora Lodge No. 48, Portsmouth, Ohio on March 3, 1853. He served as High Priest of Chillicothe Chapter No. 4 R. A. M. in the years 1883-1884-1885 and Commander of Chillicothe Commandery No. 8 in 1879. He was the first member of Scioto Lodge to be crowned an Honorary 33° Mason by the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite. Brother Rehwinkel was buried by the Grand Commandery of Ohio on June 12, 1889.

In 1887 the Masonic Review was severely condemned, by the Grand Lodge of Ohio, as an Unmasonic Publication. This is of interest to Scioto Lodge because the Masonic Review was very highly regarded by the Grand Lodge up to the year 1883 when its editor Brother Cornelius Moore passed on to his reward. The Library of Scioto Lodge contains many copies of the Masonic Review and therefore the date of condemnation is of significance to masonic students.

In 1887 there was a movement rapidly spreading over the country which threatened the life of the masonic order. This was the spread of a group calling themselves The Cerneau Bodies of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite. The name of this group related to a certain Joseph Cerneau who attempted to form a Scottish Rite Body in New York in 1807. The history of that movement is not a part of this particular paper. It is sufficient to state that organization was eventually declared to be clandestine by most regular Grand Lodges of Freemasonry. The Cerneau bodies attempted to take over the control of masonic lodges in Ohio and other jurisdictions. Several Ohio lodges suffered very severely from this attempt. New England Lodge of Worthington in particular lost control of their Masonic Hall and Charter. There resulted many legal actions both within the body of the Grand Lodge and in the Civil Courts. As a result it has been firmly established that the Grand Lodge is a Sovereign Power in so far as the control of masonic affairs are concerned. The Civil authority have fully accepted this principle. New England Lodge finally was restored to possession of its temple and other property by the Supreme Court of Ohio in September 1907.

In all of the above trouble Scioto Lodge stood as an interested bystander. It received the various edicts of the Grand Lodge and remained loyal to that body. The sole remaining evidence of this struggle is the Sovereign authority of the Grand Lodge and the Tylers or Test Oath which was designed to assist in combating such clandestine organizations as related above.

The records of March 1889 give a complete list of the minute books of Scioto Lodge, including the

dates dealt with in each book. It appears that all of these were carefully wrapped and stored in the vault of the First National Bank on March 7, 1889. They are now stored in a Fireproof Vault in the basement of the Masonic Temple.

On April 8, 1889, Reynolds Janney was raised in Scioto Lodge. He was Junior Deacon of Scioto Lodge in 1889 and 1890 and was Master of Chillicothe Council in 1892. He was at one time or another the Principal of Chillicothe High School and Wilmington High School and was Professor of Mathematics and Astronomy in Wilmington College. He built the large telescope at that institution. For a time he was engaged in the construction of bicycles and automobiles in New England. Later he was associated with Thomas A. Edison in Storage Battery Engineering. He was the inventor of Fire Control Apparatus used in the Battleships in the first World War. He received the Howard N. Potts Gold Medal and a Diploma of Scientific Merit from the Franklin Institute. He was a world traveler having visited Europe, Siberia, Japan and is said to have crossed the ocean 18 times. He returned to Chillicothe in 1938 and was buried by Scioto Lodge on October 9, 1939. He had been a Life Member of many of the most distinguished Societies of the Arts and Sciences.

On March 3, 1891, a copy of the Charter of Scioto Lodge and a list of the officers from the beginning to this date was made available to the membership at a cost of 10 cents. We do not know if this was a complete list of all officers or only of the past presiding officers.

After many debates and some abortive starts, the first serious step leading to the construction of a Masonic Home occurred in 1888. At that time the Grand Lodge appointed a committee to act with the other Grand Bodies of Ohio on the question. The selection of the site was finally announced at the Grand Lodge Meeting of October 21, 1891 in Columbus, Ohio. The cornerstone of the home was laid on October 19, 1892 by Most Worshipful Levi C. Goodale, Grand Master. On April 7, 1891, the records of Scioto Lodge noted a contribution of \$50 each from the Treasuries of Scioto Lodge, Chillicothe Chapter, and Chillicothe Commandery. From that time the Masonic Bodies of Chillicothe have continued to contribute liberally to the support of this most important enterprise. Over the years Scioto Lodge has sponsored the admission of seven persons to this home. Fortunately none of them have been children. One of our members is at the present time a resident of that home at Springfield, Ohio.

On December 1, 1891, the lodge ordered that its funds be deposited in the First National Bank and

that all payments be by check. Since that time there has been practically no discussion concerning any irregularity of book keeping by the officers of Scioto Lodge.

On April 5, 1892, the lodge purchased eleven chairs of quartered oak upholstered in long nap plain mohair plush, eighty-six feet of settees and one officers pedestal for the sum of \$800. These articles were received on July 5, 1892 and an additional pedestal was ordered at that time.

The first use of a typewriter in any of our records is noted when an auditing committee reported on August 2, 1892. The first use of a typewriter in filling out an annual return is on the occasion of September 4, 1894.

Although District Lecturers were first appointed in 1856, at which time the State was divided into 6 districts, we find no record of an official visitation to Scioto Lodge until the year 1895. The state had been divided into fifteen districts in 1888. Under the original plan Scioto Lodge was included in the first District which covered the 13 counties in the southwestern corner of the state including Cincinnati. Under the plan of 1888 Scioto Lodge became a part of the 7th district. On March 5, 1895, Right Worshipful Brother E. F. Draper, of Peebles Lodge No. 581, Grand Lecturer of the 7th district visited Scioto Lodge for the purpose of inspection. It is quite possible that visits of Grand Lecturers occurred before that date but either their visits were not particularly noted or we have overlooked the record. The installation of a telephone was first recommended in 1895.

In 1896, the Masonic Bodies of Chillicothe joined in furnishing Room No. 79 in the Tower, on the fourth floor of the Masonic Home at Springfield, Ohio. The cost to the lodge amounted to \$66.66. This room was maintained by the Chillicothe Bodies for several years. On June 2, 1896, 15 members of Scioto Lodge contributed \$100 each to the Masonic home.

On April 5, 1898, is the first report of an examination in the Third Degree. Charles W. Mills was the candidate. On September 6, 1898 is the first mention, in the records of Scioto Lodge, of the Order of the Eastern Star. This was caused by a request by a daughter of Moses Merriam, who wished to join that order in Coquille City, Oregon on September 6, 1898. The Eastern Star was first given the privilege of meeting in Masonic Temples in Ohio in the year 1893. The Order was first instituted in Chillicothe in 1928. The Eastern Star meets in its own quarters in Chillicothe, but in most places it is now common for them to meet in Masonic Temples. They have regularly contributed to the Masonic Home in Springfield and have become

recognized generally as a valuable asset to the fraternity, although, it is, of course, recognized that they cannot in any way be considered Masonic.

On March 1, 1898, Scioto Lodge was proud to be able to contribute to the relief of the survivors of the Battleship Maine.

On January 10, 1900, a meeting was held at the Masonic Temple, on East Second Street, and attended by D. H. Roche, M. J. Killits, Charles P. Mosher, Charles Hoyt, A. C. Kopp, A. E. Culter, S. M. Veail, W. J. Strickler, Allan W. Hamill, John P. Phillips, Albert Douglas and Reinhardt Wissler.

The question before the meeting was, whether or not it would be wise to take steps, looking towards the acquiring of a plot of land and the construction of a new Masonic Temple. The subject was viewed with favor and it was decided to present the question to the different Masonic Bodies of the city.

Because the tract of ground, known as the Wilson property, was to be sold at public auction, in front of the court house, on the 22nd of January of the same year, there was little time left for any great amount of preparation.

On the 18th of January an agreement was signed by John P. Phillips, D. H. Roche, A. C. Kopp, Allan W. Hamill, Reinhardt Wissler, S. M. Veail, Albert Douglas, W. L. Miller, Otto Wissler, J. W. Lash, D. M. Massie, Charles Hoyt, Charles P. Mosher, William E. Evans, S. Earl Mosher, C. Z. Erdman, and F. M. DeWeese, whereby those signing agreed that the property would be bid in at a price not to exceed \$16,500 and each of the signers would execute a note to the first National Bank for the necessary amount to pay for the property.

The property was purchased in the name of David H. Roche for \$11,650 and a note for that amount was executed to the First National Bank for the money.

On April 4, 1900, it was decided to incorporate the Masonic Temple Company of Chillicothe, Ohio, with Capital Stock \$25,000 and Articles of Incorporation were issued by the Secretary of State, forming a corporation of that name. The Incorporators were R. H. Lansing, William A. Wayland, S. Earl Mosher, Albert E. Culter, and Wallace D. Yapple.

On the sixth of April, the corporation organized by electing the following officers and directors of the company.

Directors:—A. C. Kopp, D. H. Roche, Charles Hoyt, William E. Evans, M. J. Killits, Reinhardt Wissler, Charles P. Mosher, Albert Douglas, and John Phillips.

Officers:—A. C. Kopp, President, William E. Evans, Vice President, Reinhardt Wissler, Secretary, D. H. Roche, Treasurer.

On May 13th the building committee composed of A. C. Kopp, Albert Douglas, A. E. Culter, F. M. DeWeese, Charles Hoyt, William E. Evans, and M. J. Killits, was named.

Frank L. Packard was employed as architect, and the plans prepared by him were approved. On the 7th of November, 1902, the contract for the new building was given to D. W. Henke of Athens, Ohio, for the sum of \$52,500. On May 5th, 1902, the authorized stock of the Masonic Temple Company was raised to \$40,000, divided into 800 shares at \$50 each.

Work was begun immediately, and on July 22, 1903, the cornerstone of the new building was laid with appropriate ceremonies by Most Worshipful Dr. William A. Belt, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio.

The building was completed and dedicated on the 27th day of October, 1904. The ceremonies on that occasion were in charge of the Grand Lodge, and presided over by C. G. Ballou, Most Worshipful Grand Master. The address of the day was made by Nelson Williams of Hamilton, Ohio, Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio, Past Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Ohio, Past Grand Master of the Grand Council of Ohio, and Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Ohio. Brother Williams also served in the General Grand Council of the United States of America.

The Masonic Temple Company was reorganized and incorporated as an Association not for profit on December 20, 1937, under the name of The Masonic Temple Association.

The present Masonic Temple Association are the owners and have control of the present debt free Temple, a structure having a value of many times it's original cost.

The original 800 shares in the corporation were purchased at considerable sacrifice by the members of the various bodies, and have through the years been either donated back to the corporation or bought in by the corporation, so that at the present there are no outstanding shares remaining. Said 800 shares are owned at the present time as follows:

On March 3, 1903, Scioto Lodge received 34 petitions. This was the start of a very rapid growth which started with 170 members in 1900 and reached a peak of 739 members in 1926.

On October 20, 1904, Charles Wissler contributed a letter G to Scioto Lodge. Brother George Brandle donated 3 ebony gavels from Manila through Brother Reinhardt Wissler. On January 3, 1905, Brother Nelson Williams presented a photo of himself in memory of his service as Grand Orator at the dedication of the Building.

THE MASONIC TEMPLE CLUB

The Masonic Temple Club, made up of members of Scioto Lodge No. 6, was organized shortly after moving into the present Temple, and by their club dues supported the club rooms on the fourth floor until 1909 when the Club turned over to Scioto Lodge all its equipment and furnishings for all the masons within the jurisdiction of Scioto Lodge.

There was no apparent notice of the Centennial of Scioto Lodge in the minutes of 1905, although, an inquiry concerning the early history of the lodge had been sent to the Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge in 1903.

In an edict of the Grand Master dated January 2, 1906, lodges were forbidden to hold Masonic Fairs or other entertainment for profit in which the term "Masonic" was used. This is of some interest because

the practice of holding such events was very common following the Civil War and up to the 1890's.

On January 1, 1907, the By-laws were changed to eliminate life membership (But requiring payment of Grand Dues) for all new members of the Lodge. On March 3, 1908, David H. Roche, Jr., O. J. Story, and L. S. Evans were named a committee to write the History of Scioto Lodge No. 6 for the Grand Lodge. It is presumed that this is the history which appears on page 151 of Volume 1 of the "History of Freemasonry in Ohio", as compiled by W. M. Cunningham, M. A. and published by the Grand Lodge in 1909.

On December 16, 1910, the lodge was presented with an apron which was supposed to be, "the apron of Israel Miller, the father of W. C. Miller, who was a member of this lodge about 75 years ago." "A committee was named to have this apron framed and inscribed with history". Careful study of the records does not reveal any record of an Israel Miller. It is possible that someone is mistaken and it could have been the brother who was recorded as Isaac N. Miller who was raised in Scioto Lodge on April 8, 1869.

On January 13, 1912, Scioto Lodge celebrated its One Hundredth Anniversary of receiving a charter from the Grand Lodge of Ohio. From the newspaper clippings of that event we gather the following details:

Social features predominated at the gathering and masons and their ladies assembled at the Temple in honor of the event. Brother William E. Evans prepared a brief history of the lodge, which was not read but published complete in the Scioto Gazette. The entertainment consisted of a reception and a dance and it was the largest Masonic function ever held in Chillicothe. Both floors of the Temple were crowded to capacity. The ball room upon the fourth floor and the banquet hall on the third floor were appropriately decorated. The decorations consisted of evergreen strands extending from the chandeliers to the walls, while over the alcove in the East Wall occupied by the orchestra were placed the numerals 1812 and 1912. Entertainment lasted until midnight and included pool, billiards, and cards.

On April 4, 1913, we find that Scioto Lodge made a contribution to the relief of flood sufferers. On May 6th of that same year the lodge granted permission for the organization of Logan Elm Lodge at Kingston, Ohio.

In 1913 William E. Evans became the Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Ohio. This brother had been raised in Scioto Lodge on April 16, 1868. He served Scioto Lodge as Master in 1889-1890, Chillicothe Chapter as High Priest in 1886, 87, 88, Chillicothe Council as Master in 1891, and Chillicothe Command-

ery as Commander in 1883-1884. He was Grand Recorder of the Grand Council of Ohio from 1892 through 1916 inclusive and was the second member of Scioto Lodge to be crowned an Honorary member of the 33° of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite in the year 1916.

The work of Scioto Lodge continued at a fast but uneventful pace until the location of Camp Sherman at Chillicothe in 1917. On August 16, 1917, the lodge made special provision for entertaining visitors from Camp Sherman. Almost at once a flood of candidates rolled in upon Scioto Lodge. Most of these were for courtesy work for the benefit of other lodges. A total of approximately 1200 degrees were conferred in a period of 4 years. When it is considered that the Chapter, Council, and Commandery were also very busy during this same period, and that in most cases a candidate received only one degree, it is easy to understand that the problem was entirely too much for Scioto Lodge to handle on its own. For that reason at the meeting of the Grand Lodge, at Springfield, in October 1917, Scioto Lodge requested that the Grand Lodge build a guest house in the community circle at Camp Sherman, and to furnish a full time Field Secretary to look after the members of the order who might be located at Camp Sherman.

The Grand Master of that year, Most Worshipful Henry Hagelbarger, named a committee, for that purpose, who met in Chillicothe shortly after the adjournment of the Grand Lodge, and agreed to the program. Work was immediately started on the Guest House and it was completed and dedicated at the same time the large community house was dedicated, on Thanksgiving Day 1917. Scioto Lodge contributed a proportionate share to the Grand Lodge to assist in the construction of the Guest House but, in view of the great undertaking and responsibility falling on the lodge, the Grand Lodge saw fit to remit this contribution to Scioto Lodge. The Lodge made a contribution to the erection of a Y.M.C.A. building at the camp and this was gratefully accepted. General Edwin F. Glenn accepted the Masonic Guest House for the United States Government. Other fraternal orders later built guest homes in the community group. It is noteworthy however, that the Masonic House was the first to be erected and the last to be torn down. Brother L. C. Lehman, of Versailles Lodge served as full time Camp Secretary at Camp Sherman and was given a farewell thanks by Scioto Lodge on June 25, 1920. Brother Jake Seelig served as full time Secretary at the Chillicothe Masonic Temple. All visiting members registered with him, all requests for work by outside lodges were received through him. All Candidates were prepared by him to receive the de-

gress and were notified by him when to report for the work. Under the circumstances Brother Seelig was busy not only every day but every evening as well.

Scioto Lodge met six evenings a week, and at times had as many as three lodges in operation at one time. While this was not in accordance with the laws of the Grand Lodge, it was a situation of emergency and as such recognized by the Grand Lodge. During the period from 1917 through 1920 inclusive the following is an approximate record of the work done in Scioto Lodge:

294 candidates from 157 Ohio Lodges and 108 Locations received degrees.

95 candidates from 91 out of state lodges received degrees.

200 candidates for Scioto Lodge received degrees.

Making a total of 589 candidates who received approximately 1200 degrees.

Scioto Lodge refused to accept any money for the work conferred as a courtesy for the boys at Camp Sherman. On the other hand Scioto Lodge frequently paid up to half of the degree fee for work done as a courtesy for Scioto Lodge. Many lodges including Frankfort, Waverly, the Cincinnati, Columbus, and Cleveland Lodges came to Chillicothe to assist Scioto Lodge in doing the work. Many times however, Worshipful Brother Morgan and the members from Camp Sherman were the only members of the fraternity available to do the work.

On June 24, 1921, the members of the fraternity from Camp Sherman provided a banquet for the working craftsmen of Scioto Lodge. Of course Brother Morgan was an honored guest on this occasion.

The difficulties encountered in this period were many. In 1918 the Junior Warden entered service and it was necessary to fill that station by dispensation of the Grand Master. In 1919 the Secretary found it impossible to continue and his station was filled from the side lines. In October of 1918 Scioto Lodge was ordered to discontinue meeting by the Board of Health on instructions from Major Robinson, Health Officer of Camp Sherman, because of the influenza epidemic. On October 18, 1918, by special permission of the Board of Health the lodge met to perform the funeral rite for Brother Albert M. Kunzelman. This quarantine was finally lifted on November 1, 1918 by order of Major Dana Robinson.

On February 1, 1919, the Grand Lodge of Ohio presented the furniture of the Masonic House at Camp Sherman to Scioto Lodge. This consisted of a Piano, a Victorola, Library Tables, etc.

On October 5, 1920, the Grand Master refused to grant a dispensation for Scioto Lodge to join with the Knights Templar and the Ohio Dental Society in

a memorial to Brother Frederick Rehwinkel, Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery and organizer of the School of Dentistry in Bainbridge. On this same date new rugs were ordered for Room 48 at the Ohio Masonic Home. These rugs were not delivered until May 21, 1925.

On September 29, 1925, Brother Albert Scholl was elected Grand Master of the Grand Council of Ohio. This brother had been raised in Scioto Lodge on October 4, 1894. He was Master of Chillicothe Council in 1906 and High Priest of Chillicothe Chapter in 1907. He is remembered as a prominent printer. He passed on to the other side on January 26, 1944.

In 1927 the first indication of the post war masonic depression struck Scioto Lodge. As we all know the economic depression started a few years later in 1930. During the period from 1927 to 1935 the membership of Scioto Lodge dropped from 739 members to 608 members. From 1935 to 1940 conditions were comparatively static. At that time the second world war seems to have generated a new interest in the fraternity and the membership of Scioto Lodge now stands at approximately 900 members. The above experience of boom depression and boom was shared to a greater or less extent by masonic and other fraternal associations throughout the world.

In 1931 Brother Lyle S. Evans was elected Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Ohio. Brother Evans was raised in Scioto Lodge on May 6, 1902. He served as Master of Scioto Lodge in 1916, High Priest of Chillicothe Chapter in 1908-1909 and 1917, Master of Chillicothe Council in 1916, Commander of Chillicothe Commandery in 1911. He was Secretary of Scioto Lodge from 1902 to 1911 inclusive. He served as King of the Ohio Chapter of Research from the time of its organization, January 29, 1948 until his death on June 12, 1953. He was a member of Ohio Priory Knights of the York Cross of Honor and was crowned an Honorary 33° Mason by the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite of the Northern Jurisdiction in 1920. He was the third member of Scioto Lodge so honored. Brother Evans was a member of many committees of the Grand Bodies of Ohio and was very widely known as a student of Freemasonry. By profession he was an attorney. Brother Evans was also a member of the Temple Association up to the time of his death.

On August 30, 1933, the boys Band from the Ohio Masonic Home entertained the lodge. On this occasion Brother Frank Henn, Jesse Weidman and Charles Z. Erdmann received fifty year medals.

On May 15, 1936, Brother Elmer R. Arn, Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Ohio opened Scioto Lodge and requested Worshipful

Brother Ralph B. Templin to preside over a joint meeting of Scioto Lodge and the Grand Lodge of Ohio. At this meeting Brother Lyle S. Evans read a short history of Scioto Lodge and Right Worshipful Brother James J. Tyler read a History of the Grand Lodge of Ohio.

On June 10, 1937, minute book No. 1 of Scioto Lodge was loaned to the Historical Society of Ross County for exhibition in a glass case, under lock and key, during the Sesquicentennial Celebration of the Northwest Territory. On September 7, 1937, the lodge resolved to support the Sesquicentennial Celebration.

On May 9, 1938, Scioto Lodge participated in a parade celebrating the founding of the Northwest Territory. This participation was by special dispensation of the Grand Master. It took the form of a float depicting the formation of the Grand Lodge of Ohio. This float was judged to be the most Historically Correct float in the parade and won a prize of \$25. Participating in this display were the six oldest members of Scioto Lodge able to be present as follows:—

A. W. Hamill as Worshipful Master
W. A. McNeilis as Senior Warden
Reynolds Janney as Junior Warden
W. A. Rhodes as Senior Deacon
C. H. Dunlap as Junior Deacon
W. H. Hyson as Tyler.

The above represented the six lodges forming the Grand Lodge. The Middle Chamber Pillars, the Seal of the Grand Lodge and the altar with the Great Lights were also represented.

On April 30, 1939, church services were held at Walnut Street Methodist Church commemorating the 150th anniversary of the inauguration of George Washington as President of the United States.

Brother Max M. Fulks was elected Grand Master of the Grand Council of Ohio in 1947. Brother Fulks was admitted a member of Scioto Lodge on December 17, 1936, from Dresden Lodge No. 103, Dresden, Ohio. He served Chillicothe Chapter as High Priest in 1939, Chillicothe Council as Master in 1933-34 and 35 and Chillicothe Commandery as Commander in 1943. He is also a member of St. Jerome Conclave No. 12 of the Red Cross of Constantine and is a designate to be crowned an Honorary 33° Mason at the 1955 session of the Supreme Council of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, of the Northern Jurisdiction. In that event he will become the 5th brother of Scioto Lodge so honored by that august body.

On October 28, 1950, Poage Lodge No. 325 of Ashland, Kentucky, visited Scioto Lodge under dispensation of the Grand Master of Kentucky and of the Grand Master of Ohio. The third degree was con-

ferred in most impressive form upon a candidate of Poage Lodge, and a dinner was served by Brother E. A. Royer. During the year 1950 the kitchen was furnished with new kitchen facilities.

Brother Howard W. Laymon was crowned an Honorary 33° Mason, member of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite at the 1952 session of the Supreme Council and was the fourth brother of Scioto Lodge so honored. Brother Laymon was raised in Scioto Lodge on November 29, 1916. He served as Master of Scioto Lodge in 1923, as High Priest of Chillicothe Chapter in 1919-1920, as Master of Chillicothe Council in 1925 and as Commander of Chillicothe Commandery in 1922. He is a member of Ohio Priory Knights of the York Cross of Honor and has served as District Inspector of the 5th District of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Ohio. Brother Laymon is also President of The Masonic Temple Association.

On Thursday, April 17, 1952, the Worshipful Master, Ray O. Duffy, requested that all Past Masters and present officers meet on Wednesday evening, April 30th at 7:30 P. M. for the purpose of considering what should be done to prepare for the celebration of the

Sesquicentennial of the Chartering of Scioto Lodge by the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, on September 10, 1805.

On Wednesday evening, April 30, 1952, a meeting was held in the Club rooms agreeable to the above mentioned request of the Worshipful Master. A general discussion was held and it was concluded that a Sesquicentennial Celebration should be recommended to Scioto Lodge. The Worshipful Master appointed Brother William A. Reppel, the Senior Past Master, general chairman for the observance and appointed a steering committee consisting of:

The following roster of membership of Scioto Lodge is presented as copied from a card index prepared directly from the minutes of Scioto Lodge Meetings. This card index contains the actual dates of all work done in the lodge from the beginning, including admissions and funerals as well as courtesy work in the interest of Sister Lodges. We have omitted a part of these records for the following reasons:

1. Any member who has been expelled for unmasonic conduct has been omitted because masons look upon such persons as unworthy and do not recognize that they ever were masons.

2. Candidates who received their work as a courtesy to a sister lodge have been omitted in the interest of saving space.

3. Candidates who received only a part of their work in Scioto Lodge either withdrew and completed their work elsewhere or were not sufficiently interested to complete their work at all. Under such conditions it did not seem worth while to include them in this list.

4. It is inevitable that mistakes have occurred, not only by the present writer, but also by the past officers and members by whom the original records were kept and approved. For these errors we are truly sorry. We suggest that variant spelling has been frequently observed in the records. When looking for a name, try to think of another way in which it could have been spelled or possibly misinterpreted.

5. Names preceded by the character † indicate that the brother was not a member of Scioto Lodge but a Sojourner who was buried by the lodge.

6. Names of current members are indicated by the character * preceding the name.

7. Past Masters are indicated by the character § preceding the name.

8. It is possible that further details may be available in the card index for those who may inquire.
