

On July 20, 1969, as Commandery of Apollo 11 Lunar Module, Neil Armstrong was the first person to set foot on the moon. His first words after stepping on the moon were "THAT'S ONE SMALL STEP FOR MAN, ONE GIANT LEAP FOR MANKIND." were televised to earth and hear by millions. But just before he re-entered the lander he made the enigmatic remark "Good luck Mr. Gorsky. Many people at NASA thought it was a casual remark concerning some rival Soviet Cosmonaut. However, upon checking, there was no Gorsky in either the Russian or American space programs.


Over the years many people questioned as to what the—Good Luck Mr. Gorsky statement meant but Armstrong always just smiled.

On July 5, 1995 in Tampa Bay, Florida, while

answering questions following a speech, a reporter brought up the 26 year old question about Mr. Gorsky to Armstrong. This time he finally responded because Mr. Gorsky had died. so Neil Armstrong felt he could now answer the question. Here is the answer to "Who was Mr. Gorsky".

In 1938 when he was a kid in a small midwestern town, he was playing baseball, he was playing baseball with a friend in the backyard. His friend hit the ball which landed in his neighbor's year by their bedroom. His neighbors were Mr. and Mrs. Gorsky. As he leaned down to pick up the ball young Armstrong hear Mrs. Gorsky shouting at Mr. Gorsky, "SEX!!! You want SEX!!!? You'll get sex when the kid next door walks on the moon!!!"


God Can Handle It Day By Day
