Brother John D. O'Connor and his wife Christina traveled to northern Ohio and took these photos at the Perry's Victory and International Peace Memorial which commemorates the Battle of Lake Erie at Put-in-Bay near Ohio's South Bass Island. A century ago, 5,000 Masons traveled to Put-in-Bay to lay the cornerstone of a monument that still stands as a towering symbol of South Bass Island and the War of 1812.

On July 4, 2013 an estimated 2,000 Masons were expected to participate in a re-enactment of that cornerstone ceremony at Perry's Victory and International Peace Memorial. The event is one part of Put-in-Bay's Fourth of July celebrations featuring a parade, concert, naturalization ceremony, fireworks, and other activities.
