Tuesday, November 3, 2020

The Annual Meeting of Scioto Lodge #6 and the election of officers will be held according to Chapter 18.01 of the Code of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons. The elective officers or a Lodge shall be (1) Master; (2) Senior Warden; (3) Junior Warden; (4) Treasurer; (5) Secretary; (6) Senior Deacon; (7) Junior Deacon (8) Tyler (9) One Trustee for a three year term. Appointed Officer of the Lodge shall be Chaplain, Senior Steward and Junior Steward and shall be installed within 60 days from the date of election.

Section 18.01 (c) Nominations for election of Lodge officers and trustees shall not be permitted. Further, Section 18.01 (d) Electioneering in connection with the selection of an officer or trustee of a Lodge is strictly forbidden and constitutes un-Masonic conduct.

Chillicothe Chapter #4 to Celebrate its 200th Anniversary

The Excellent High Priest announced that during the Reaffirmation Service of October 24, 2021 Chillicothe Chapter #4 will be recognized on its 200th Anniversary. In the documented history prepared by Excellent High Priest Allan W. Hamill whose research resulted in the published history of Chillicothe Chapter #4. The paper was entitled appropriately..." One Hundred Year of Capitular Masonry" and read <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>December 13</u>, 1821 at the 100th Anniversary of Chillicothe Chapter #4.

Past High Priest Oakley B. Graves updated the history when he served as High Priest in 1971-1972 when Chillicothe Chapter #4 celebrated its Sesquicentennial Anniversary at a program on May 20, 1972.

From the year 1792 until the organization of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Ohio on October 24, 1816, the Capitular Degrees were conferred in Ohio by Chapters held under the authority and auspices of American Union Lodge #1; Nova Cesarea Harmony Lodge #2; New England Lodge #4 and Scioto Lodge #6.

As a matter of Masonic history, up to 1972 in nearly all Grand Jurisdictions, Craft Masonry controlled and conferred until its authority all other grades in Free Masonry was recognized as possessing supreme authority in their government, and all subsequent independent organization of Capitular and Templar grades, were by and with its consent, tacitly or officially given. The growth of Capitular Masonry in Ohio may be termed phenomenal, from its less then 20 working Chapters at the close of its first quarter of a century in 1841 to 153 working Chapters and a membership of over 17,000 Companion (circa 1972).

Veterans' Administration Hospital—September 23, 2020




