Companion Ryan Adams Installed as Most Excellent Grand High Priest!

On October 5, 2023, Ryan W. Adams was installed as the 208th Grand High Priest of Royal Arch Masons of Ohio. Most Excellent Companion Ryan is the first “Grand Presiding Officer” from the Chillicothe Masonic Bodies since Cecil Blair in 1967, who was Grand Commander of the Knights Templar of Ohio.

Ryan was born November 30, 1980, in Hillsboro, Ohio to William C. Adams, Jr. and Cindy (Clemmons) Adams. He attended Paint Valley Local Schools in Bainbridge, OH and graduated from Ohio University with both an Associate’s & Bachelor’s Degree in Business Management & Economics. He also has post graduate work in Career & Technical Education through Western Michigan University. While being a community banker by trade, Ryan currently manages the Sales Operations group with Computer Services, Inc. located in Paducah, KY where he helps community banks in core processing decisions.

Ryan began his “Masonic Journey” 20 years ago on March 29, 2003, at the Majestic Theatre in downtown Chillicothe at the 2nd Annual Grand Master’s One Day Class becoming a member of Scioto Lodge #6. Membership to the Chillicothe York Rite Bodies followed in May 2003, and membership to the Valley of Columbus AASR was completed in November 2003. Endowment Membership Certificates Presented

WB Evan Steele and WB Fritz Schafer were recently presented with certificates from the Grand Lodge of Ohio for purchasing a Lifetime Membership Endowment that will entitle them to be dues free for the rest of their lives.

Any Master Mason in good standing is able to take advantage of this offer by submitting a one time payment of \$800 to the Grand Lodge of Ohio. This is then paid back to the lodge each year in the form of member dues by the Grand Lodge even after the endowed members passing.

What makes this so attractive at this time is by the end of the year, the fee for an endowed membership will be increasing from \$800 to \$1,600. Also to be considered is Scioto Lodge currently has the lowest dues in the State of Ohio but given the increased nature of expenses, this may not always remain to be the case.

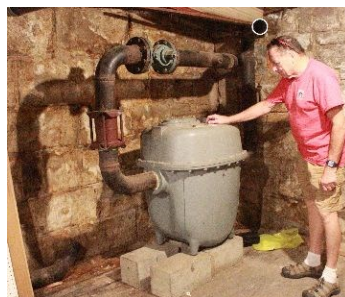
