Scioto Lodge #6 Scholarship Awards Night and Banquet

Recipients of the Scioto Lodge #6 Scholarship Awards will be invited, along with their family, to attend a dinner at the Masonic Lodge. This dinner will take place on the 3rd Thursday in June prior to our Stated Meeting. They will be presented with the scholarship award after dinner at that time.

The Scholarship Committee is currently meeting to select the recipients of the three \$1,000 scholarships to be presented to this graduating class of 2024.

In order to be eligible, the student must attend school in one of the seven High Schools located in Ross County. We had a total of 19 girls and 10 boys submit applications for consideration.

One boy and one girl with top honors, ACT scores, scholastic achievement, school participation and community service will be selected to receive one of the \$1,000 scholarships.

In addition, one student that has/had a family member who is affiliated with a Masonic Order will be considered for the 3rd \$1,000 scholarship.

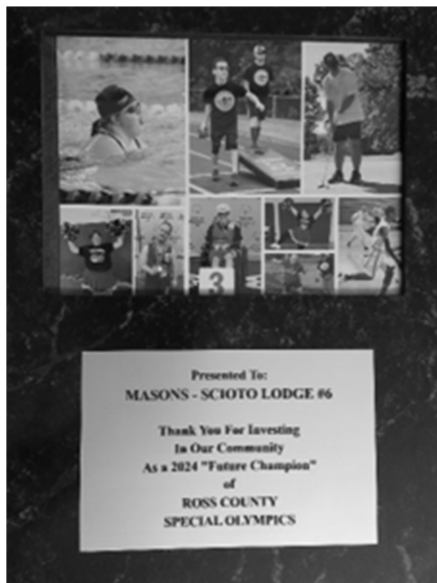
Wills expressed gratitude for the honors and stayed for the remainder of the meeting where he saw the lodge confer the Master Mason degree on another brother.

What is your Masonic Goal?

We each joined the Masonic fraternity for many reasons. I believe that the prime Masonic goal is to make good men better. Yes, we do charity work. We do community improvement; but the overriding reason to continue the order is to improve ourselves and through that improve others.

My personal goal has been for 15 years is to be an Observant Mason.* Observant Masons try to instill and practice the *intent* of the founders of speculative Masonry. We believe and know that they were NOT building a social club or a service organization.

I am an Observant Mason through years of trying. It is difficult, I believe, because many of my Brothers, from the youngest Entered Apprentice to many Grand Lodge officers, are ignorant of that *intent*.

From 1982 until 2007 I was what many in Masonry call a Card Carrying Mason (CCM). I believe that CCMs are the norm throughout the craft. It is hard to argue otherwise. CCMs go through their Initiating, Passing and Raising for their own personal reasons. After that they attend infrequently and remain ignorant of the *intent* of the original Masonic founders' purpose of setting up a ritualistic method of instilling an order of Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. The Observant movement in Masonry strives to correct that trend.

In general, most CCMs don't know their Lodge Brothers well because they haven't taken the time to do so. As a CCM I was busy raising my family, making a living, and being involved in my church and community. In my heart I knew my Degree Obligations. There is certainly no question that those things are important. But in my normal, ordinary life I really didn't get to know my Lodge Brothers.

In my 42-year history as a Mason some of my best Fraternal experiences have been in getting to know my fellow Lodge Brothers, most of whom I would not have known otherwise. From trash truck drivers to CEOs, these good men came to Lodge for renewal and learning. When I finally did start attending regularly, I was saddened to realize how many of the older Brothers were not on the sidelines. Most of the line officers involved in my joining were gone: passed to the Celestial Lodge or infirmed and unable to attend. The WWII veterans had nearly all passed: most of the Korean War vets were too. I regretted not getting to know them better. The loss of their experiences and Masonic knowledge caused me to rethink my Masonic life. The Past Masters, Chaplains, Wardens, Deacons and Tylers were valuable to the Lodge because they attended and passed on the heritage of the Ritual and the Light of Masonic education. They did the same for me and for each of you.

Recently, as we Raised a friend of more than fifty years, I thought of the many who had performed that same work and taught us all over the years. They did so by attending and becoming proficient in the work. As an Observant Mason I strive to know the work better, remaining as proficient as possible. The Craft only survives if Brothers do this important work.

As good men and even by being to the outside world an example of a 'Good man, a Mason', Card Carrying Masons will not perpetuate the Order. Only those who attend and learn the Craft as best as they possibly can will be able to do that. (*See OBSERVINGTHECRAFT.COM)

If you have not attended our Lodge recently, we, the Past Masters, current Master and officers of the Line extend a warm welcome your return to Scioto Lodge #6. Any of us would be happy to "brush you up" on the pertinent ritual for the evening.

While the Ritual remains the same, a few things have changed:

Typically, at 6:15 we now enjoy a well prepared, full meal on our good china with real utensils before each Lodge meeting. We feel that we, our Brethren deserve that.

Gone are the constant bad pizza, cold chicken or cold cuts once served after the meeting.

Our founders put on a "Festive Board" for all Brethren to enjoy and develop camaraderie during the meal.

We try to streamline the business portion of Lodge meetings to make the Lodge experience more meaningful and pleasant.

Speaking of pleasant, when you return, I think that you will immediately notice an atmosphere of welcome and a less stern, lighter presence in the Lodge. Come, see it for yourself.

The formal dress code of the past is much less adhered to by attending Brothers. Yes, the Line Officers are usually in tuxedos, but it is far more common to see casual wear rather than coats and ties on the sidelines. We want to see your smiling faces and not necessarily your finest attire.

And finally, Scioto Lodge #6 now numbers less than 350 Brothers (in 1982 we had nearly 1000). Now, we are smaller in numbers, more centered on observing the original ideas and intents of Masonry. We would enjoy your attendance and participation.

Come to Lodge. See the difference while becoming a better man and a better Mason.

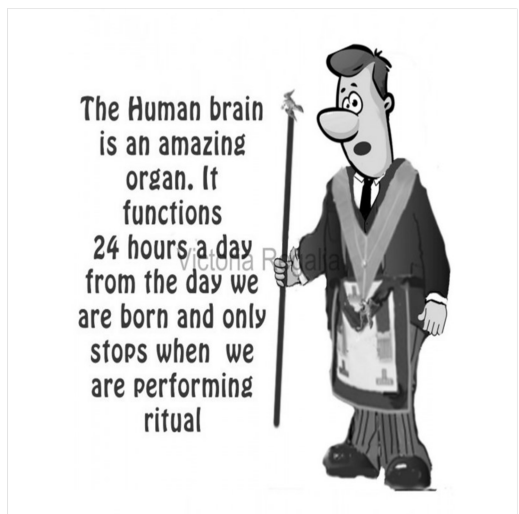

Contact Information for Transportation to Lodge Meetings / Functions
