Scioto Lodge #6 Scholarship Awards Night and Banquet

Recipients of the Scioto Lodge #6 Scholarship Awards will be invited, along with their family, to attend a dinner at the Masonic Lodge on June 3rd at 6:00 pm just prior to our Stated Meeting. They will each be presented with the scholarship award after dinner but prior to our opening Lodge in the Blue Room.

The Scholarship Committee has met to select the recipients of the three \$1,000 scholarships to be presented to this graduating class of 2025. It was a hard decision again this year as we had a total of 45 applicants.

In order to be eligible, the student must attend school in one of the seven High Schools located in Ross County. We had a total of 30 girls and 15 boys submit applications for consideration.

One boy and one girl with top honors, ACT scores, scholastic achievement, school participation and community service will be selected to receive one of the \$1,000 scholarships. In addition, one student that has/had a family member who is affiliated with a Masonic Order will be awarded the 3rd \$1,000 scholarship.

Thanks to the Scholarship Committee consisting of WB's, James Fritz Schafer, Michael L. Hines, Steven R. Grant and Michael A. Ash, who has been on this committee since it's inception in 1998.
